Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as
common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance
with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and
governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-Q and supplements
thereto.

II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 3 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-Q and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of August 4, 1990 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such

procedures provide parties with "...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental for set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect August 4, 1990 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Exhibit B - Summary of changes


Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement 3. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be

implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

2 ITEM 296-B

FIBRE DRUMS FOR LIQUIDS OR ARTICLES IN LIQUIDS

Sec. 1. The terms 'liquid' or 'articles in liquid' as used in this rule apply to articles, or that portion of articles present in an amount over 10 percent by weight of a whole, having a viscosity measurement of less than 5000 centipoises. Measurement must be made at temperatures up to 100 degrees Fahrenheit, except as to articles normally shipped under refrigeration, in which case the measurement must be made at shipping temperatures. Measurement shall be determined by a viscometer of the Brookfield type equipped with a No. 4 spindle rotated at 20 revolutions per minute or by any other instrument giving an equivalent measurement.

Sec. 2. The requirements, limitations and specifications set forth in the table in this section for the numbered types shown therein must be observed. The sidewalls of all drums must be convolutely, not spirally, wound and no single ply should be less than .012 inch in thickness, with outer ply, in the absence of specific waterproof treatment, sized to resist the effect of casual water, and all plies firmly glued together. The minimum requirements in the table for sidewall, top and bottom are governed by either the weight of contents in column B or by the capacity in column C, whichever limitation calls for the higher minimum requirements. Gallonage capacities are net, but sufficient outage must be provided.

Drums filled to net capacity with water must withstand without leakage a tipover fall on concrete on the cover chime followed by a diagonal drop on the bottom chime sufficient to provide at least 500 foot-pounds impact, except that a maximum height of drop shall not exceed two feet and the minimum height of drop not less than one foot.

These drums must not be used again for shipments of liquids or articles in liquids after contents have been removed, except when containers, closing devices, and required interior protection are in such condition that they will protect contents as efficiently as new containers.



(B)—Type 3C drums equipped with a bag-type contoured liner of flexible high density polyethylene not less than four mils in thickness having a circular bottom without gussets or folds, are not restricted to Note 5(A) commodities.

These liners (A) and (B) must be protected at the bottom chime by one of the following methods:

1. By interposing a flexible creped Kraft paper liner having a basis weight of not less than 80 pounds between it and the drum bottom and extending not less than four inches up the sidewall.
2. By interposing a flexible five-ply corrugated paper disk between it and the drum bottom.
3. By a plastic cuff not less than .004 inch thick permanently attached to the liner which must extend up the drum sidewall not less than four inches and extend under bottom of liner not less than two inches from the chime.
4. Other methods of protection are authorized as necessary, provided the drum filled to capacity with water can withstand a one hour vibration test (ASTM D 999 A) without failure of the plastic liner. Failure will constitute deformation or evidence of liquid penetration of the outside ply with inspection to be made four hours following vibration test. Drums capable of passing vibration test will not be restricted to commodities listed within paragraph (A).

Closure of liner must be made liquid-tight by tying or sealing or by folding the bag out over the top metal chime of the drum and closing it off with a plastic sealing disk held in position by a rubber or plastic gasketed cover and locking band.

Note 6—5-gallon containers may have tops made of fibreboard providing they meet the minimum requirements specified for fibreboard bottoms. Tops must be of minimum thickness of .170 inch and test not less than 800 pounds.

Note 7—Top covers must be constructed of injection molded high density polyethylene or polypropylene homopolymer or copolymer and have a minimum thickness of .090 inch. Top covers must have at least two concentric rings of not less than 1/8 inch depth, except when cover is of a minimum thickness of .125 inch cover may have one concentric ring. Closure must be effected by a liquid-tight gasket and a lever locking ring of 22 gauge metal.

Type 3B-L fibre drums not exceeding 15 gallons capacity may have top covers constructed of injection molded high density polyethylene not less than 75 mils in thickness meeting the above testing requirements, except stress crack resistance test is not required for this application. Cover must be flanged to fit inside top diameter of drum and must be securely metal stitched to drum sidewall.

Note 8—Type 4A drums, integrally lined, of maximum 55-gallon capacity, filled with water to rated capacity, must be capable of withstanding a four-foot drop onto a solid surface on top and a second four-foot drop diagonally on the bottom without failure. Having passed this performance level, construction minimums and weight maximum will not be subject to the above table. The "Certificate of Maker," as required of all fibre drums per Item 297, must be amended to show "TYPE OF FIBRE DRUM — 4A" in lieu of "SIDEWALL TEST _____ POUNDS PER SQUARE INCH" and "NET WEIGHT LIMIT _____ POUNDS."

Body— Doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing 350 pounds, panels forming ends and sides with full-overlap bottom flaps.

Top Cap— Design style of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing 275 pounds having a flange depth of ten inches, fastened to body.

Interior Forms— Corner posts, clearance pads and support forms of either scored and folded or solid built-up corrugated fibreboard construction.

New Item 173 is being published to indicate requirements established by the California Public Utilities Commission in regard to the statement of liability limitations on carrier-prepared shipping orders and bills of lading. These requirements were established in decision 90-05-055 in OII.89-04-015, dated May 22, 1990. The requirements only have application on intrastate California shipments.

In the interest of tariff simplification, clarification and uniformity, items 13200 and 152080, naming "Baskets, waste," are cancelled and reestablished in proper alphabetical sequence as "Wastebaskets," under the appropriate generic headings with no change in the applicable classes. This is a result of carrier action on Docket 904, Subject 15.

The density-based provisions of items 16140, 16141, 16142 and 16143, applying on "Decoys, bird, NOI," are being cancelled with reference to the density-based provisions of item 15520, applying on various athletic or sporting goods. The description of item 15520 will concurrently be amended by the addition of "Decoys, bird, NOI."

This action will foster tariff simplification, as item 15520, being a single entry, is less complex than the present set of four items. It will also have the effect of consolidating the 2 but less than 3 pcf density group, at class 250, and the 3 but less than 4 pcf group, at class 200 (as now published in item 16141, subs 3 and 4, respectively), into a single 2 but less than 4 pcf group, at class 250 (per item 15520, sub 3). In this connection, under the present two groups, the densities of bird decoys, NOI, break down as follows:

- 2 but less than 3 pcf: 2.02 to 2.92 pcf, avg. 2.37 pcf
 - 3 but less than 4 pcf: 3.04 to 3.92 pcf, avg. 3.51 pcf
- Under the single group, the figures are as follows:
- 2 but less than 4 pcf: 2.02 to 3.92 pcf, avg. 2.94 pcf

The single density group, at class 250, is more reflective of the densities exhibited than the present two groups at classes 250 and 200, respectively. It is also consistent with provisions recently assigned to other products exhibiting transportation characteristics similar to those of the involved bird decoys.

With respect to stowability, handling and liability, the involved bird decoys are not shown to exhibit any unusual problems.

The subject action will also have the effect of assigning to bird decoys, NOI, TL classes and minimum weights - or where average loads of at least 10,000 pounds cannot be achieved, AQ classes - for each density group, in lieu of the alternating TL class/minimum weight scale (as now provided in item 16143). In this regard, the classes and minimum weights assigned are the same as those assigned to other products exhibiting similar transportation characteristics.

The amendment of the description of item 15520 to include "Decoys, bird, NOI," will assist the tariff user in locating the applicable classification provisions and, thus, fosters tariff clarification.

Concurrent with the aforementioned changes, the "bumping" Note, item 16146, is being cancelled with reference to the "bumping" Note, item 15521. These changes are the result of Docket 904, Subject 2.

Item 15520 - See justification for items 16140, 16141, 16142, and 16143. Items 24220, 24240, 24260, 24280, 27780, 27800, 49795, 56400, 108145, 108150, 134010, 139640, 156850 and 177120 are amended to reference a new Note restricting their application on any commodity which is defined as a medical waste in 40 CFR 259.30. The DENTAL OR HOSPITAL SUPPLY GROUP is amended to read DENTAL, HOSPITAL OR MEDICAL SUPPLY GROUP. These changes are made in the interest of tariff clarification.

Item 98480, Hazardous Waste, and its accompanying Note, item 98481, are cancelled with reference to a new item and Note, under the Waste Materials Group, providing for hazardous waste and medical wastes at class "0." A new Note is also established defining medical wastes. Since medical wastes possess the same unique transportation characteristics as hazardous waste, these changes are in the interest of tariff simplification, clarification and uniformity.

Information available on medical wastes indicates that the liability assumed by the carrier is the controlling characteristic. This is indicated in the following summary of their transportation characteristics.

Of the factors which comprise the characteristic of liability, the ability to damage other freight is extremely high in comparison to similarly packaged freight. Any release of medical wastes can contaminate other freight in the vehicle in which it is being transported. This would expose the carrier to substantial additional liability for the loss of these products. The density of these products ranges greatly and is dependent on the exact material being shipped. When handling regulated medical wastes, carriers must exercise more care to prevent a hazardous materials incident and must comply with marking and placarding requirements associated with transporting medical wastes. Stowing medical wastes is comparable to that of similarly packaged freight; however, care must be exercised to ensure that the medical waste is not loaded adjacent to freight with protruding parts.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 3 of Docket 904.

Items 24220, 24260, 24280, 24282, 27780, 27800, 27802 - See justification for item 24220.

Item 33800 - See justification for item 93060.

Item 43080 presently provides for "Ammonium silicofluoride" subject to classes of 70 LTL, 35 TL and 36 MW. It is being amended to provide two subprovisions. Sub 1 will maintain the classes presently applicable for this commodity when it is shipped in bags or boxes. Sub 2 is being established to provide reduced classes of 65 LTL, 35 TL and 36 MW when this commodity is shipped in bulk in barrels. Additionally, a reference is being added to item 43080 to indicate that the commodity is a hazardous material.

Ammonium silicofluoride is a regulated hazardous material classified as an ORM-B commodity under DOT regulations. It is a lower-toxic poison which can be harmful if swallowed, irritating and corrosive to skin when wet, gives off very toxic fumes when heated to decomposition and becomes corrosive to metals when exposed to moisture. When shipped in bulk in barrels ammonium silicofluoride has a density of 49.26 pcf. and a value of \$.40 per pound. The characteristics of handling, liability and stowability are all impacted to varying degrees by the hazardous nature of the commodity. Care must be exercised in handling to maintain the integrity of the package, and the commodity should not be loaded next to foodstuffs (which impacts negatively upon stowability). Liability is impacted negatively by the potential risk this product poses to other commodities shipped with it and by the threat its toxicity poses to carrier personnel, emergency response personnel and the public in the event of a spill.

This change results from Docket 904, Subject 17.

Item 45060 naming "Magnesium Fluosilicate (Magnesium silicofluoride)," applicable to this commodity when shipped in bulk in barrels, Sub 1, from 70 LTL, 37.5 TL and 40 MW to 65 LTL, 35 TL and 36 MW. Additionally, reference is being added to item 45060 to indicate that the commodity is a hazardous material.

Magnesium silicofluoride is a regulated hazardous material. It is a lower-toxic poison which can be harmful if swallowed, irritating and corrosive to skin when wet, gives off very toxic fumes when heated to decomposition and becomes corrosive to metals when exposed to moisture. When shipped in bulk in barrels, magnesium silicofluoride has a density of 43.10 pcf. and a value of \$.40 per pound. The characteristics of handling, liability and stowability are all impacted to varying degrees by the hazardous nature of the commodity. Care must be exercised in handling to maintain the integrity of the package, and the commodity should not be loaded next to foodstuffs (which impacts negatively upon stowability). Liability is impacted negatively by the potential risk this products poses to other commodities shipped with it and by the threat its toxicity poses to carrier personnel, emergency response personnel and the public in the event of a spill.

This change results from Docket 904, Subject 17.

Item 45270, naming "Methyl Bromide or Methyl Bromide Insecticide," is being amended by increasing the applicable classes from 60 LTL and 35 TL to 77.5 LTL and 45 TL. (The 40,000 pound minimum weight will be unchanged.) Also, the packaging requirements will be amended by removal of the reference to the outer shipping container, "cans."

Item 45270 applies on methyl bromide - a poisonous insecticide - as classed in the U. S. Department of Transportation regulations as Poison B. Pursuant to the Note, item 45272, and consistent with the Department of Transportation regulations, the methyl bromide may contain up to two percent chloropicrin. (Some shipments of methyl bromide are classed by the

Department of Transportation as Poison A. Those shipments are subject to item 85900, naming "Gases, NOI; Gas Mixtures, NOI; or Liquids, NOI; Class A Poison," at classes 200 LTL and 70 TL, with a minimum weight of 30,000 pounds, and are not involved in this action.)

Methyl bromide is shown to exhibit densities ranging from 52.90 to 68.10 pcf. As is the case with all poisons, however, density is not the controlling transportation characteristic in the classification of methyl bromide. Rather, stowability, handling and liability are controlling. In this respect, methyl bromide classed as Poison B exhibits the same less-than-favorable stowing, handling and liability characteristics as other Poison B insecticides, including:

- 1) being prohibited from being coloaded with foodstuffs and feedstuffs;
- 2) requiring extra care in handling to prevent a hazardous incident;
- 3) requiring additional paperwork, in compliance with regulations;
- 4) requiring marking and placarding, in compliance with regulations;
- 5) having the potential for damaging other freight as well as carriers' equipment;
- 6) having the potential for injuring carrier personnel as well as the public at large.

The increase in the classes in item 45270 will establish the same class level for methyl bromide as was recently assigned to other Poison B insecticides.

With regard to the amendment of the packaging requirements, "cans" are obsolete as outer shipping containers. Consequently, removal of the reference to "cans" fosters tariff simplification.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 904, Subject 18.

Item 50755, "Assemblies, smoke flue or chimney," is amended by virtue of an amendment to Note, item 50757 reading, "Applies on smoke flue or chimney assemblies consisting of pipe, elbows, or tees, equipped with lugs; asbestos gaskets or pipe covering; ceiling, roof or wall plates; chimney, weather or cleanout caps; flashing collars; roof flanges; insulating bands or supports; bolts, nuts or washers, in boxes or crates," to allow an assembly to consist of one or more of the named components in the interest of tariff clarification. In addition, the reference to asbestos is removed as asbestos gaskets or pipe coverings are no longer allowed to be used in smoke flues.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 904, Subject 1.

Item 55120, naming "Curios, NOI, consisting of bead work, prehistoric implements, images and Chinese or Japanese curios, in barrels or boxes", with classes of 200 LTL, 100 TL, 10 MW is cancelled with reference to either the density-based classes of item 56290, which applies on Decorations, Notions or Novelties, or item 63925, having application on Exhibits, Museum, Articles of Antiquity or Antiques, with classes subject to the determination of individual carriers. Concurrently, the Note item 56292, which has application on item 56290, is amended to specifically name Curios, and to clarify that antiques, articles of antiquity and museum exhibits are not embraced by the provisions of item 56290.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 8 of Docket 904.

Items 56400 and 56401 - See justification for item 24220.

New item 61990, is established for electrical or radio frequency interference filters, at class 77.5 LTL, 45 TL and 40 MW. These products exhibit an average density of 36.3 pcf and an average value of \$11.93 per pound. They do not exhibit any unusual handling and stowing characteristics. The LTL class 77.5 reflects the relatively high value per pound and density of the commodities and is the same class assigned to similar products.

This addition is the result of action on Docket 904, Subject 19.

Item 63825 - See justification for Item 55120.

New Item 72495, naming "Coatings or Seasonings, food, cheese flavored, in bulk in bags," with classes of LTL 60, TL 40, MW 36 is established to specifically name these commodities to remove interpretation difficulties. The shipper proponent furnished information stating that the density is 38 PCF, coupled with an average value per pound of \$1.45. No indication was present as to adverse handling or stowability characteristics.

These provisions are the result of Subject 14, of Docket 904.

Item 93060 is cancelled with reference to item 33800; concurrently item 33800 is amended to name canopy, awning, carport or boat shelter frames. Information indicated that SU steel awning frames, moving under the provisions of item 95190, Hardware, NOI, had an average density of .70 pcf. Consequently, specifically naming these commodities under the provisions of item 33800 provides classes more in keeping with the varying material constructions and forms of shipment of the products, and is therefore, more consistent with NCC guidelines.

These changes are the result of action on Docket 904, Subject 5.

The description of item 94160, naming "Clips, ceiling or roofing, iron," is being amended to specify steel as well as iron construction. The applicable classes and minimum weight will be unchanged.

Ceiling or roofing clips made of steel are already classified in item 94160 by virtue of Item (Rule) 110, Section 14. The rule states that "'Iron' as used in the description of an article includes 'Steel' and vice versa..." This rule notwithstanding, some tariff users find the present classification of steel ceiling or roofing clips unclear because only "iron" is specified in the description of item 94160. Amending the item description to specify "iron or steel" will provide the requisite clarification for those tariff users.

This amendment is the result of action taken on Docket 904, Subject 13.

Item 98390, hats, caps or bonnets, NOI, is amended by deleting the reference to item 98394, an alternating TL class/minimum weight scale. Concurrently, TL classes and minimum weights have been established within each subprovision, except where average loads of at least 10,000 pounds cannot be achieved. In these instances, AQ classes have been established. In this respect, the classes and minimum weights established are the same as those assigned to other commodities exhibiting comparable transportation characteristics.

Items 98391, 98392 and 98394 are cancelled with reference to item 98390 in the interest of tariff clarification, simplification and uniformity.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 6 of Docket 904.

Items 98480 and 98481 - See justification for item 24220.

Item 100100, naming "Hose, garden or water, plastic with fittings, with or without fabric or wire reinforcement," is cancelled with reference to item 100130, naming "Hose, NOI". The companion note, item 100102, is cancelled because it has no further application. This item publishes classes based on a full range densities.

This action was based on an evaluation of the following transportation characteristics. Garden or water hose ranges in density from 3.0 to 21.92 pounds per cubic foot (PCF). There are no unusual stowability or handling problems associated with the transportation of these commodities. Values of these commodities range from \$.57 to \$1.52 per lb.

Item 100120 is amended to read, "Hose, rubber, reinforced with fabric or wire, with or without attached fittings, with or without metal armor or sheathing, other than garden hose, in packages, having density in pounds per cubic foot of 6 or greater." The amendment is made to insure that garden hose will not be classified in this item, but rather in item 100130.

Item 100130 is amended to read "Hose, NOI, or tubing, flexible, with or without fittings, in packages." There is no change to the remainder of the item. The addition of the terminology "with or without fittings" will clarify the fact that these commodities may have fittings when moving subject to this item.

These changes are the result of Docket 904, Subject 7.

Items 108145, 108150, 108154 - See justification for item 24220.

Item 108950, naming "Lahn (Lame), copper," and item 113750, naming "Lupulin," are cancelled as obsolete. Motor carrier traffic studies show no movement of these commodities by motor common carrier.

This is a result of carrier action on Docket 904, Subject 16.

Items 109400 and 109404 - See justification for item 109479.

Items 109479, 109482, 109490, 109500, 109820, 109830 and 109856 and their attendant Notes are cancelled with reference to two new density-based items and corresponding Notes under the Lamps or Lighting Group. The first, item 109400, applies on various types of lamps and assigns classes as follows: Less than 4 pcf, 250 AQ; 4 but less than 8 pcf, 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW; 8 but less than 12 pcf, 92.5 LTL, 65 TL and 20 MW; and 12 pcf or greater, 70 LTL, 40TL and 36 M.W.

The second, item 109810, applies on various types of lighting fixtures and assigns classes as follows: less than 4 pcf, 200 LTL, 100 TL and 10 MW; 4 but less than 8 pcf, 100 LTL, 70 TL and 20 MW; 8 but less than 12 pcf, 85 LTL, 55 TL and 26 MW; and 12 pcf or greater, 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW. The subject commodities have been the source of interpretation difficulties for many years and their transportation characteristics have been under investigation for the past two years.

Lamps range in density from 0.80 to 47.13 pcf. Lighting fixtures range in density from 1.0 to 62.60 pcf. Both lamps and lighting fixtures are generally shipped in rectangular fibreboard boxes. Small lightweight boxes make good top freight, and heavier packages may require bottom loading. Due to the fragile nature some of these products, care should be taken not to load heavy freight on top of them. Lamps and lighting fixtures are

susceptible to damage, but improvements in their packaging has continued to reduce claims. Lamps range in value from \$0.39 to \$27.28 per pound. Lighting fixtures range from \$0.93 to \$79.12 per pound.

The new provisions described above are published with an effective date of December 12, 1990.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 10 of Docket 904.

Item 113750 - See justification for 108910.

Items 134010 and 134012 - See justification for item 24220.

Items 139640 and 139642 - See justification for item 24220.

Items 152080 and 154450 - See justification for item 13220.

Items 156850, 156852, 177120 and 177122 - See justification for item 24220.

Item 190795, which names "Covers or Tops, pickup truck bed," is cancelled with reference to new item 192995, naming "Tops or Covers, pickup truck bed," which is in the proper sequential order. The provisions for this item were printed out of order in the reissue of NMFC 100-Q, effective May 5, 1990.

This change results from handling accorded Subject 20 of Docket 904.

Item 192930, naming "Tiring, rubber, in packages," is cancelled from the Classification as obsolete.

This change is the result of action on Subject 12 of Docket 904.

Item 192995 - See justification for 190795.

Items 196160, 196161, and 196162 - See justification for item 24220.

Package 2172, a 3 ply Kraft shipping bag used exclusively for the movement of Phthalic Anhydride in item 4460, has been amended to allow for a total basis weight of 150 pounds and a net weight of 56 pounds (25 kg). Experience was accumulated under the conditions of Test Shipment Permit T-899-21.

Action was taken resultant of Docket 904, Subject 21.
