

Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as
common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance
with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and
governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-Q and supplements
thereto.

II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 6 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-Q and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of January 14, 1991 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such

procedures provide parties with "...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental for set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect January 14, 1991 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this filing are the following exhibits detailing such revisions:

Exhibit B - Summary of changes

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement 6. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be

implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

In view of the fact that the Classification is national in character, having application on intrastate traffic in forty-three states and three Canadian provinces, as well as on interstate traffic, it is desirable in the interests of uniformity and to minimize confusion in the application of its provisions, that this Supplement be accepted for filing and permitted to become effective.

Item 187755, "Tubs, hot, KD; or Hot Tub Systems," is cancelled with reference to new item 100160, reading "Hot Tubs, KD; or Hot Tub Systems." At the same time, the Note, item 187757 is cancelled with reference to new note item 100161 containing identical language subject to the new item.

All of these provisions are being amended to more clearly identify the commodities for which these items are intended, in keeping with NCC policies and directives regarding tariff simplification, clarification and uniformity.

These changes are the result of action on Docket 907, Subject 15.

Items 23670 and 23672 - See justification for item 4630.

The Note, item 30102, which restricts the entire "Brass, Bronze or Copper" generic by specifying that "Brass, bronze or copper, or brass, bronze or copper articles containing in excess of two percent beryllium will be classed as metal alloys, NOI," is being amended to further restrict the generic so as not to apply where beryllium content is .5 percent or greater. As amended, the Note will read, "The provisions subject to this grouping do not apply where beryllium content is .5 percent or greater. Where beryllium content is from .5 percent to two percent, item 135440 naming 'Beryllium Bronze or Beryllium Copper, or Beryllium Bronze or Beryllium Copper Articles, NOI, will apply. Where beryllium content exceeds two percent, item 136500, naming Metal Alloys, NOI,' will apply." Concurrently, new item 135440 is being added for "Beryllium Bronze or Beryllium Copper, or Beryllium Bronze or Beryllium Copper Articles, NOI, containing .5 percent to two percent beryllium," with classes based on actual value.

Information of record shows that beryllium bronze or beryllium copper, or articles thereof, differ significantly from more common bronze or copper, or comparable articles thereof, only in the value-per-pound component of the liability characteristic. Value per pound provides carriers with a measure of their potential liability and is evaluated only in conjunction with the other elements of the liability characteristic. In this respect, the value per pound of beryllium bronze or beryllium copper, or articles thereof, is shown to be markedly higher than that of the more common bronze or copper, or comparable articles thereof. Moreover, it is shown that articles made from these metals are not damage-free.

The actual value provisions of new item 135440 are established in recognition of the relatively higher values exhibited by the subject beryllium bronze or beryllium copper, or articles thereof, as well as the variance in values which can result from such factors as market fluctuations, the degree of manufacturing involved and the specific amount of beryllium in the alloy.

New item 135440 is being established with three attendant Notes. The Note, item 135441, will clarify that, "Where beryllium content exceeds two percent, item 136500, naming 'Metal Alloys, NOI,' will apply." In this regard, it is pointed out that item 136500, which assigns classes based on released value, presently applies where beryllium content exceeds two percent. Hence, no change is being made in the application of the released-value provisions.

Item 135442 is a packaging Note specifying that "Plate, sheet or strip, 38 gauge or thicker (.004 inch or thicker), may be shipped in bundles, subject to the Note, item 106722."

The Note, item 135443, is an inadvertence clause setting forth how shipments will be classified where the shipper fails to certify the actual value at time of tender and the shipment is inadvertently accepted.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 907, Subject 7.

Item 39655, 39656, 39780 and 39782 - See justification for item 21225.

Item 44620 having application on Glycols, is published to show the correct chemical name (2,2-Dimethyl-1, 3-Propanediol) for Neopentyl, which was erroneously listed as (2,2 Dimethyl-1, 3-Pentanecliol) in NMF 100-Q.

This amendment is published to correct a printer's error.

The Note, item 46032, publishing actual value limitations on certain "Resins, coal, tar or petroleum, or Resin Compounds," as named in item 46030, is being amended to provide the tariff user with specific direction as to how shipments will be classed when tendered without a shipper provided certification of value.

Item 49885 (and related Notes, items 49886 and 49887) covering "clothing, waterproof or protective outerwear, etc." are being cancelled with reference to item 49880, naming "Clothing, NOI." Like item 49885, item 49880 provides classes based on the density and value of the embraced clothing.

Item 62580 embracing "Electric Motors, weighing each less than 5 pounds, used, having value only for reconditioning or for salvage of parts" when value does not exceed 50 cents is being amended through application of the amended Note, item 62582, which provides the tariff user with specific direction as to how shipments are to be classed when tendered without a shipper certification of actual value.

Note, item 85002, as referenced in item 85000, providing for mixed TL shipments of various games or toys, is being amended to provide specific direction to the tariff user as to how shipments will be classed when inadvertently accepted without the required shipper provided certification of actual value of named articles.

Item 88150, naming "Glassware, NOI," with classes based on actual value is being amended to provide clear direction to the tariff user that when the actual value exceeds \$19.00 per pound or if the shipper does not provide the required certification as to actual value, the shipment will be classed under the provisions of item 88140 and its attendant Notes.

Item 155590, naming "Pictures, paperboard, framed with plastic frame, without glass, nested, actual value not exceeding 40 cents each" is being amended through the Note, item 155592, to provide direction to the tariff user as to how shipments will be classed when the shipper fails to certify the actual value at time of tender.

The Note, item 168942, as referenced in item 168940, having application on whole, scrap plastic, sound recording discs, etc., actual value not exceeding 16 cents, is being amended to provide information to the tariff user as to how shipments will be classed when the shipper fails to certify the actual value.

The Note, item 169607, as referenced in item 169605, having application on "Rifles or Carbines, new, with telescopic sight in same package, actual value not exceeding \$200.00 each," is being amended to clearly indicate to the tariff user how shipments will be classed when shipper fails to certify the actual value at time of tender.

Item 180050 covering "Sweepings, Tailings or Refuse, NOI" and its attendant Notes, items 180051, 180052 and 180053 are being cancelled and reestablished under the WASTE MATERIALS GROUP as explained below.

New item 195890 and attendant Notes, items 195891 and 195892 replace items 180050, 180051 and 180052 dealing with "Sweepings, Tailings or Refuse, NOI" which will locate the provisions under an appropriate generic heading. The actual value groupings and classes in Subs 1 through 5 are unchanged. Sub 6 is amended to include all values exceeding \$50.00 per pound. The "Not Taken" provisions of Sub 7 are eliminated. The Note, item 195892 is amended to reflect the adjustment in the actual value grouping and the elimination of the "Not Taken" provision.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 3 of Docket 907.

Items 49505 and 49507 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 49830, 49832 and 49852 - See justification for item 4630.

Items 49885, 49886 and 49887 - See justification for item 46030.

Item 51460, naming "Pipe Fittings, NOI: Iron or steel, with or without metal seats, plain, galvanized or cadmium coated, but not plated with other metals," is amended by the addition of the phrase "zinc coated or plated," in the interest of tariff clarification. Zinc coated or plated pipe fittings are currently provided for in item 51460 by virtue of the fact that the process of "galvanizing" involves coating the metal by passing it through a bath of molten zinc or by electrodeposition of zinc. By specifically naming zinc coating or plating in item 51460, the provisions would be further clarified.

This change is the result of action taken on Subject 6 of Docket 907.

Items 57320, 57322, 57760, 57762, 58050, 58051, 58350, 58351, 58540 and 58542 - See justification for item 4630.

Item 58700 is a new item which is established for "Contraceptive Sponges, cellular, expanded or foam plastic, impregnated with spermicide," at class 110 LTL, 70 TL and 18 MW. Concurrently, item 59400, "Sponges or Devices, vaginal contraceptive, cellular, expanded or foam plastic, impregnated with spermicide," is cancelled with reference to the new item. The new item will not contain a reference to item 60000. The new wording is more reflective of the involved commodity, and is in keeping with NCC guidelines with respect to tariff clarification.

These changes are the result of action on Docket 907, Subject 5.

Items 59320 and 59322 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 61310, 61311, 61680 and 61682 - See justification for item 15885.

Item 62560 - See justification for item 21225.

Items 62580 and 62582 - See justification for item 46030.

Item 62647 and 62655 - See justification for item 21225.

Items 63472 and 63478 - See justification for item 4630.

Items 67060 and 67400 - Supplement 5 contained an amendment to items 67060 and the cancellation of item 67400. These changes were the result of the approval of Subject 11 of Docket 906. Subsequent to the inclusion of the approved provisions in Supplement 5, the disposition of Subject 11 was appealed. At its November 6, 1990, meeting, the NCC considered the appeal and voted to disapprove the proposal. Consequently, in this Supplement, those changes are being withdrawn and the former provisions of items 67060 and 67400 are being reinstated.

Items 69930, 69932, 71120 and 71122 - See justification for item 4630.

Item 84320, having application on "Games or Toys, wooden or wood and steel combined," is cancelled with reference to the full-scale density provisions of item 84260, "Games or Toys, NOI."

The facts of record indicated that while the characteristics of handling, stowability and liability all appear to be within the normal parameters of other boxed freight, the density characteristic varied from 1.04 to 34.44 PCF. As with other games or toys with similar characteristics, the Committee voted to establish classifications to reflect the varying density characteristics.

These provisions result from Docket 905, Subject 1.

Items 136760, 136762, 136990, 136992, 138890, 138892, 138940 and 138941 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 155590 and 155592 - See justification for item 46030.

Items 155760 and 155765 - See justification for item 21225.

Item 156630 - See justification for item 21225.

The LTL class for Sub 2 of item 156850, naming "Gloves, plastic or rubber, not combined, reinforced nor assembled with other materials; Film type, not molded, expendable," is reduced from 77.5 to 70. Information of record revealed a density range from 19.80 to 21.87 pcf, with an average density of 20.79 pcf and no unusual handling, stowing or liability problems.

This change is the result of action taken on Subject 9 of Docket 905.

Items 161580 and 161582 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 168940, 168942, 169605 and 169607 - See justification for item 46030.

Items 169610 and 169612 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 171620 and 171622 - See justification for item 4630.

Items 180050, 180051, 180052 and 180053 - See justification for item 46030.

Items 181880, 181882 and 181883 - See justification for item 15885.

Items 187755 and 187757 - See justification for item 21225.

Item 188320, Naming "Valves, pneumatic tire," is amended by changing the applicable classes from 100 LTL, 70 TL and 24 MW to 70 LTL, 40 TL and 35 MW. Information of record indicated a density range from 20.20 to 66.00 pcf, with an average density of 48.00 pcf. No unusual handling, stowing or liability characteristics were indicated. In addition, the obsolete packaging term "in barrels" is eliminated in the interest of tariff simplification and clarification.

This change is the result of action taken on Subject 16 of Docket 907.

Item 194300, naming "Batteries, electric, dry cell, NOI, other than carbon zinc or alkaline type; old, spent, having value only for reclamation of raw materials, actual value not exceeding 85 cents per pound, in bags, barrels or boxes," is cancelled as obsolete. Concurrently, companion note item 194302 is also cancelled as obsolete. Motor carrier traffic studies indicate no movement of these commodities.

This is the result of Docket 907, Subject 10.
