At their regular Freight Traffic Committee meeting in San Francisco, on February 12 and 13, carriers approved for publication the addition of the following species of wood to the opening paragraph of Item 1000, Page 8, Supplement 86 to PSFB Tariff 48-V.

Albizzia Naio Norfolk Island Pine Bald Cypress Ohia Brush Bóx Candlenut Paper Bark Elapa Port Orford Cedar Royal Poinciani Fig Ironwood Saman Jacaranda Silk Oak Sugi Jhalna Toona Koa Turpentine Kopiko

Subject to minimum weight provided in connection with applicable rate but in no case will minimum weight be less than 44,000 lbs., for cars not exceeding 42 feet in length and 54,000 lbs., for cars exceeding 42 feet in length, subject to Item 476.

The publication will result in reduction.

The above named species are the common names of wood species on the Island of Hawaii. They are used in the manufacture of veneer and plywood. There will soon be a movement of these products and carriers have approved the above amendment on the same basis as native woods.

Under PSFB Proposal 6707, carriers approved for publication the commodity description as indicated in Exhibit "A".

This publication would apply generally throughout the Tariff except on non-intermediate rates that apply in connection with Part 1 of Item 1000. This applications seeks authority under Section 460 to allow proposed publication to also apply in connection with said non-intermediate rates.

Tariff 48-V names various rates which are departures from the long and short haul provisions of the Public Utilities Act, and are published under appropriate Section 460 authority.

In connection with the long and short haul departures herein involved, it is respectfully submitted that justification for such departures applies to the same extent as in connection with all other commodities for which rates named in this tariff and for which appropriate Section 460 authorities have been granted by the Commission, and that continuation of the same rate relationships for these particular commodities as for all other commodities named in the tariff is to the best interests of all concerned.

JUSTIFICATION.

Explanation of carrier abbreviations used in Columns A and B of Exhibit "A"

ISF La Salle Trucking Company: RPL Ringsby-Pacific, Ltd.

Each of the above-named carriers is in its own right a certificated common carrier by virtue of one or more decisions rendered by the California Public Utilities Commission.

While the Public Utilities Code does not require authority for common carriers to establish joint rates, publication of joint rates proposed herein would, in some cases, result in violations of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code as shown in the following example: A shipment originating at San Diego on the lines of La Salle Trucking Company and destined to Santa Ana on the lines of Ringsby Pacific, Ltd., would move from San Diego to Los Angeles over the lines of La Salle Trucking Company to be interchanged at Los Angeles with Ringsby Pacific, Ltd., for final delivery to Santa Ana. In view of the fact that rates to be charged are generally minimum rates prescribed by the Commission, it can readily be seen where the rates from San Diego to Santa Ana would be lower than the rates for the actual route of movement. Therefore, authority is sought to depart from Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code in order that no so-called long-short haul violations may exist. Any number of examples could have been cited.

PROPOSED PUBLICATION

It is proposed to amend Item No. 1550 contained in Section 1 of the subject tariff as shown on Exhibit A-1 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

EXHIBIT "B"

JUSTIFICATION

The proposed amendment is based upon alternative application provisions as contained in the Commission's Minimum Rate Tariffs and authority was taken from Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau, Tariff No. 300-A, Item Nos. 1290, 13451, 13680 and 20070. Applicant has been charging class rates in the past.

Authority is sought under Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code due to the divergence in routing between that employed by applicant and that employed by competing rail carriers. An example of where authority is necessary under Section 460 would be a shipment originating at Index No. 4506 Los Angeles and destined to Index No. 5080 San Diego. In all probability this shipment would move south via Interstate Highway 5, passing through the intermediate point of Leucadia, which is not served by competing rail carriers. This would require applicant to charge class rates to this point which are higher than the rates proposed to be published. Therefore, authority is sought to depart from Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code in order that no so-called long-short haul violations exist. This is merely one example utilizing only one point of origin and one point of destination proposed to be published. Any number of examples could have been cited, utilizing all points of origin and all points of destination proposed to be published.

Authority is sought under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code to publish the proposed changes on less than statutory notice for the reasons set forth above and in order that carrier may be competitive with permitted carriers who may charge the proposed rates at vill.

JUSTIFICATION

Explanation of carrier abbreviations used in Columns A and B of Exhibit "A":

BCX Bay Cities Express Co. STER Sterling Transit Company, Inc.

Each of the above-named carriers is in its own right a certificated common carrier by virtue of one or more decisions rendered by the California Public Utilities Commission.

While the Public Utilities Code does not require authority for common carriers to establish joint rates, publication of Joint rates proposed herein would, in some cases, result in violations of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code as shown in the following exemple: A shipment originating at Oakland on the lines of Bay Cities Express Co. and destined to Sacramento on the lines of Sterling Transit Company, Inc., would move from Cakland to Sunnyvale over the lines of Bay Cities Express Co., to be interchanged at Sunnyvale with Sterling Transit Company, Inc., for final delivery to Sacramento. In view of the fact that rates to be charged are generally minimum rates prescribed by the Commission, it can readily be seen where the rates from Oakland to Sacramento would be lower than the rates for the actual route of movement. JUSTIFICATION

Applicant carrier herein seeks to have his rates applying on Brandy or Wine, in bulk in tank trucks, adjusted upward to a level as set forth in Exhibit "A". Sa increase will average approximately 3.4% over present rates.

The rates in Item 6020 have been in effect at their present level for distances up to and including 220 miles since July 11, 1966 and over 220 miles to and including 1300 miles since October 11, 1967. No upward adjustments have been made in the rates since they were originally established.

Since July of 1966, your Commission has authorized 3 increases in rates of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 as follows:

Decision No. 70963 of July 15, 1966 Decision No. 72849 of August 1, 1967. Decision No. 73816 of March 5, 1968. In effect, transportation rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 have been increased 2 times that was subsequent to the time in 1966 that the rates in Item 6020 were originally established.

Wine, transported in bulk in tank trucks, is exempt from minimum rate regulation. The above cited decisions did not provide for increases in rates on commodities for which minimum rates have not been established, therefore carrier has no automatic relief from rising expenses, such as so called wage off-set increases which were the basis of the above decisions.

The increases in truckload rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, under the above Decisions, taken collectively, would amount to approximately 10%. In addition, your Commission has authorized two increases to the rail lines and to rotor carriers who assess rail rates under alternative application under provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, These were Decision No. 73520 (Ex Parte 256) and Decision No. 75135 (Ex Parte 259-A).

Applicant carrier has witnessed similar increases in operating expenses as those used for justification in the applications and petitions that resulted in the Decisions cited herein.

Since carrier published the present rates it has experienced substantial increases in its operating costs. Such increases have resulted primarily from upward adjustments in wage rates and so-called fringe benefits payable to employees of highway carriers, together with adjustments in related employers payroll expenses. A summary of the abovementioned increases are set forth in explicit form in letter of January 22, 1969 from Mr. B. C. Smithcamp of applicant carrier to Mr. Jim Finney, Director of Traffic, E. & J. Gallo Winery, the shipper. Said letter is attached hereto, designated Exhibit "B" and by this reference hereby made a part hereof.

Applicant carrier's revenues resulting from the proposed increase in rates would approximate 3.4% and would not increase its California intrastate gross operating revenue by as much as one (1%) percent.

The rates that are proposed to be increased apply for only one shipper account. Applicant hereby states that B. & J. Gallo Winery is the only shipper account that has utilized these rates since they were established in 1966 and to the best of applicant's knowledge no other shipper will wish to use applicant's services in the forseeable future.

The shipper, E. & J. Gallo Winery, has been made aware of the sought increases and the level of the proposed rates as is set forth in Exhibit "A". Shipper was receptive to and supports applicant's request for an increase in the rates as evidenced by letter of January 28, 1969 from Mr. J. P. Feeney, Director of Traffic, E. & J. Gallo Winery to applicant carrier. Copy of said letter is attached hereto, designated as Exhibit "C" and by this reference hereby made a part hereof.

For reasons set forth hereinabove, it is respectfully requested that authority be granted under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to publish the proposed increased rates as set forth in Exhibit "A".

The increase in rates is urgently needed. The rates at their present level are not compensatory and applicant needs relief as soon as possible. Applicant is cognizant of the fact that the increases in rates as sought herein were eligible to be handled under a formal Shortened Procedure Tariff Docket Application, but because of the urgency of the matter, chose to present its justification in this informal Special Tariff Docket Application. Too, applicant has pointed out that only one shipper utilizes its service under the rates involved herein and as shown in Exhibit "C", said shipper has no objection to the increases in rates sought herein, and would not object to the grant of authority to publish on less than statutory notice.

It is respectfully requested that permission be granted to put the increased rates into effect on not less than ten (10) days notice so that carrier may begin to get relief from increased costs at earliest date possible.

EXHIBIT "B"

JUSTIFICATION

The provisions of Item No. 2020 are those which produce somewhat higher charges than those provided for in the Commission's Minimum Rate Order No. 10 covering the transportation of cement. They were put in when cement carriers were originally certificated as a result of legislative action, to protect the common carriers against operations in mountainous territory insofar as mountain territory exists in the northern portion of the state. The present method of computing mileage to points located in mountain territory is as set forth in Item No. 2020 as presently constituted.

Considerable discussion has taken place over a period of time between carriers and northern shippers pertaining to the level of rates to be assessed in combination to off-map points in northern mountain territory. After considerable open discussion by the shippers and carriers, a docket was introduced and handled by this Bureau's regular Standing Rate Committee at one of its regular meetings, such docket being assigned Docket No. 125, and providing, as may be seen by the proposal contained herein, a somewhat lower level of rates for off-highway mileage factors than presently provided by reference to the combination of rates, using as a second factor the mileage rates named in Section 3 of the tariff. For example, the rate in Section 3 of the tariff for nothern territory for over 0 but not over 3 miles on bulk cement is six cents, whereas the proposed rate for combination use is two cents. Attention is called to the fact that the bulk rate for 20 to 25 miles constitutes no change from the present provisions nor does either the bulk or package rate for over 25 but not over 30 miles. In spite of these rates being the same, they are being included in this proposal in the event there is an increase in the mileage rates in Section 3 before the expiration of the proposed provisions.

Authority is being sought under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to effect the proposed provisions since if they are allowed to expire at the end of one year as proposed an increase would occur at that time. The expiration date has been requested since both carriers and shippers have agreed that cost problems to the off-highway northern mountain territory points are rather difficult to figure and will actually have to be subject to the carrier's experience over the period of time requested herein. If the proposed provisions prove equitable to the carrier, undoubtedly the expiration date will be eliminated. It is obvious that should the proposed provisions prove to be not compensatory, the carriers would wish them to expire as sought herein. The various shippers have agreed to this experiment and, of course, the immediate result would be lower charges to the shippers; and in the long run certainly the shippers could not be damaged since they would at least enjoy the proposed lower rates for the trial period of a year.

Authority is being sought herein under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code to establish the proposed provisions on less than statutory notice in order that the shippers may be in the position to take advantage of the lower provisions as quickly as possible and to place this Bureau's carriers in a more competitive position with cement contract carriers who can charge the proposed provisions or even lower provisions at will.

PROPOSED PUBLICATION

It is proposed to amend Item No. 1807 contained in Section 1 of the subject tariff as shown on Exhibit A-1 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

EXHIBIT "B"

JUSTIFICATION |

The proposed amendment is based upon alternative application provisions as contained in the Commission's Minimum Rate Tariffs and authority was taken from Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau, Tariff No. 274, Item No. 436 (6th Revised Page 45-EE. Applicant has been charging class rates in the past.

Authority is sought under Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code due to the divergence in routing between that employed by applicant and that employed by competing rail carriers. An example of where authority is necessary under Section 460 would be a shipment originating at Index No. 2034 Anderson and destined to Index No. 984 Sacramento. In all probability this shipment would move south via U.S. Highway 99, passing through the intermediate point of Pairpoint, which is not served by competing rail carriers. This would require applicant to charge class rates to this point which are higher than the rates proposed to be published. Therefore, authority is sought to depart from Section 460 of the Public Utilities. Code in order that no so-called long-short haul violations exist. This is merely one example utilizing only one point of origin and one point of destination proposed to be published. Any number of examples could have been cited, utilizing all points of origin and all points of destination proposed to be published.

Authority is sought under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code to publish the proposed changes on less than statutory notice for the following reasons:

2nd Revised Page 140-AA provided a rate from Anderson to Stockton and Sacramento published at 50½ and 43½ cents per 100 pounds respectively, minimum weight of 40,000 pounds. These rates were contained in a single rate block as shown in the attached Exhibit B-1 attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof, which is provided for the convenience of the Commission's staff.

When the provisions of Cal. P.U.C. Order No. STD-5911 dated December 10, 1968, we're published on 3rd Revised Page 140-AA, an inadvertent compiling error occurred which increased the 43½ cent rate to Sacramento to 50½ cents; per 100 pounds. This, of course, was an unauthorized increase and indirect violation of Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code. Therefore, authority is requested under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code to eliminate this unauthorized increase on one day's notice.

The Commission, by its Decision No. 75339 dated February 18, 1969, among other things, has prescribed specific mileages between various points and junction points in the Vandenberg Air Force Base area. The Commission, by the foregoing decision, is making these prescribed mileages a part of the Commission's Distance Table 7, effective March 29, 1969, and has authorized highway common carriers to make similar adjustments on less than statutory notice. THE PRESENT RATES WERE ESTABLISHED TO APPLY ON COMMODITY WEIGHING 35 POUNDS OR MORE PER CUBIC FOOT IN DENSITY. THE STORER (SHELL CHEMICAL COMPANY) HAS RECENTLY BEGUN STORAGE OF THE SAME COMMODITY WHICH WEIGHS UNDER 25 POUNDS PER CUBIC FOOT. THE AVERAGE WEIGHT OF COMMODITY WEIGHING UNDER 25 POUNDS PER CUBIC FOOT, AND THE AVERAGE WEIGHT OF COMMODITY WEIGHING UNDER 25 POUNDS IS APPROXIMATELY 20 POUNDS PER CUBIC FOOT.

The proposed rate of 40.2 cents per unit for marking unitized containers was developed from a time study made during the month of January 1969. (See EXHIBIT 8.) The marking of 238 units required 7.55 man hours of labor. Each mark consisted of 8 lines similar to that shown in EXHIBIT C. The 8 lines of marking per unitized container is the normal mark regardless of the composity being shipped. Due to the size and weight of the units marked, a fork lift is necessary in the marking operation. The present man hour rates of \$6.34 per hour for labor, and \$6.34 per hour for use of fork lift equipment, as set forth in Rule No. 35 of California Warehouse Tariff Bureau Warehouse Tariff No. 28-A, Cal. P.U.C. No. 193, were combined to form the rate shown in EXHIBIT C of \$12.68 per hour.

Rule No. 41 of Warehouse Tariff No. 28-A, Cal. P.U.C. No. 193, provides a rate of 7.4 cents per 100 pounds for carloading or unloading. The proposed rate of 14.8 cents per 100 pounds for commodity having a density of under 25 pounds per cubic foot is justified in the same manner as the handling rate, i.e.! The number of man hours required to perform the carloading on the light-density commodity is twice that of the heavy-density commodity.
