RBSOLUTION

RESOLUTION SU-43, ORDER DIRECTING SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY TO PAY A PENALTY IN THE AMOUNT OF FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$40,000) FOR VIOLATIONS OF GENERAL ORDER 112-E.

SUMMARY

- 1. On September 27, 1996, a six-inch steel distribution line ruptured during a pressure test conducted by Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas). The incident resulted in significant property damage and an injury.
- 2. The Utilities Safety Branch (USB) staff investigated the incident and its findings are summarized in an Investigation Report that was produced by USB in February 1997.
- 3. This resolution directs SoCalGas to pay a penalty in the amount of (\$40,000), as agreed upon on the attached Settlement, based on USB's Investigation Report recommendation.

BACKGROUND

- 1. Section 315 of the Public Utilities Code grants the Commission authority to investigate utility accidents.
- 2. Section 2107 of the Public Utilities Code grants the Commission authority to penalize a public utility which fails to comply with its decisions and rules with a fine up to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for each violation.

DISCUSSION

- 1. SoCalGas did not completely purge the 6-inch pipeline prior to the pressure test allowing a combustible mixture of gas and air to form inside the pipeline. This is a violation of General Order (GO) 112-E, Reference Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations (49 CFR), Part 192, Section 192.629.
- 2. SoCalGas performed welding on the pipeline while containing a combustible mixture causing an explosion. This is a violation of GO112-E, Reference 49 CFR, Part 192, Section 192.175.

FINDINGS

- 1. SoCalGas is in violation of Commission GO112-E, Reference 49 CFR, Part 192, Sections 192.629 and 192.751.
- 2. SoCalGas should be ordered to pay penalty, in accordance with Section 2107 of the Public Utilities Code, of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for each of the above violations.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

SoCalGas shall pay a penalty of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to the Commission for remittance to the State Treasury within 30 (thirty) days of this Resolution.
