SUBJECT: AT&T Communications. Order authorizing the withdrawal of AT&T InterLATA only WATS.

WHEREAS: AT&T COMMUNICATIONS, by Advice Letter No. 77 filed January 21, 1987, requests authority under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective the following tariff revisions:

1. Withdraw AT&T InterLATA only WATS.
2. Revise WATS wording to more clearly describe the service.

WATS (Wide Area Telecommunications Service) permits customers to make (outward WATS) or receive (inward WATS or 800 Service) long-distance voice or DATAPHONE data set calls and to have them billed on a bulk rate rather than individual call basis.

For AT&T InterLATA only WATS Service the customer is furnished an AT&T WATS or AT&T 800 access line. The service is provided using the LEC (Local Exchange Company) access line and the public switched network to or from other California locations outside of the LATA in which the access line is located. In providing this service AT&T pays the LEC a nonrecurring charge of \$514. This nonrecurring charge covers the LEC's cost to provide the access line and is passed on to the customer. However, a customer may purchase a combined intraLATA/interLATA access line from the LEC and pay a service charge of \$70 (subsidized). The interLATA portion of this service is provided by AT&T, the same as in the AT&T interLATA only service. Consequently, AT&T has no customers for the AT&T interLATA only service and therefore no reason to continue this offering.

Approving this advice letter will have no revenue or service impact.

The Commission finds that the conditions authorized in this Resolution are just and reasonable and present conditions, as they differ from the conditions in this Resolution are for the future unjust and unreasonable; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) Authority is granted to make the above revisions effective on March 9, 1987.

(2) All tariff sheets filed under Advice Letter No. 77 shall be marked to show that such sheets were authorized by Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. 12005.

The effective date of this Resolution is today.
