FRESNO MSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP (U-3005-C). ORDER AUTHORIZING INCREASED AIR TIME CHARGES FOR "ROAMER" CELLULAR MOBILE TELEPHONE SERVICE IN THE FRESNO, VISALIA AND BAKERSFIELD SERVICE AREAS. RESOLUTION NO. T-12022.

Fresno NSA Limited Partnership, by Advice Letter No. 5, filed Narch 5, 1987, and Supplement filed Narch 10, 1987, requests authority under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective the following tariff revisions:

To increase the per minute rate for roamer customers entering the Fresno, Visalia, and Bakersfield areas to \$0.65.

The present rate is \$0.45 during peak hours, and \$0.27 off-peak.

"Roamers" are cellular radiotelephone users whose home system is not this utility, but have arranged for access to this system while they are in this utility's serving area.

The increased rate is necessitated by increased costs associated with this offering, including allowance for fraud, the cost of joining a clearing house, and the introduction of positive mobile number validation of a roamer. The utility estimates the annual billing increase from this revision to be \$145,000 in calendar 1987.

The Commission finds that the rates, charges and conditions authorized in this Resolution are just and reasonable and present rates, charges and conditions, as they differ from the rates, charges and conditions authorized in this Resolution are for the future unjust and unreasonable; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) Authority is granted to make the above revisions effective on Nay 14, 1987.

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(2) Schedule Cal PUC No. 3-T, 2nd Revised Sheet No. 5, shall be marked to show that it was authorized by Resolution No. T-12022.

The effective date of this Resolution is today.
