R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14257. VENTURA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY.
EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A NEW CELL
SITE IN THE VENTURA METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 20, FILED ON NOVEMBER 16, 1990.

SUMMARY

VENTURA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY (Ventura Cellular), by Advice Letter No. 20, filed on November 16, 1990, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add two new cellular radiotelephone cell sites to its existing cellular system serving the Ventura Metropolitan Statistical Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the new cell sites, known as the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate site, located at 880 South Westlake Boulevard, Westlake Village, California and 147 North Brent Street, Ventura, California respectively. No protests to this Advice Letter have been filed.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in its application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 20 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

Ventura Cellular has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the City of Thousand Oaks, the City of San Buenaventura, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

The proposed construction will be located at 880 South Westlake Boulevard, Westlake Village, California and 147 North Brent

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Street, Ventura, California and are known as the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate site respectively. The Thousand Oaks site will consist of eight antennas on top of roof of an existing building and an equipment shelter. The Ventura Alternate site will consist of twelve antennas on top of an existing building and an equipment shelter.

The Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate sites will become part of Ventura Cellular's cellular system serving the Ventura Metropolitan Statistical Area.

Public notice that VENTURA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 20 requesting authority to construct the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate site appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's November 21, 1990 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of Ventura Cellular's Advice Letter No. 20 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been filed on Ventura Cellular's Advice Letter No. 20.

FINDINGS

1. On November 16, 1990, VENTURA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 20 requesting Executive authorization to construct the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate cell sites located at 880 South Westlake Boulevard, Westlake Village, California and 147 North Brent Street, Ventura, California respectively.
2. The Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate sites represent a additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in D.87-06-012, granting Ventura Cellular a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 20 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. A Ventura Cellular officer signed a declaration which states that Ventura Cellular has received all necessary

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permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 20.

6. Advice Letter No. 20 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate cell sites: the City of Thousand Oaks, the City of San Buenaventura, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) VENTURA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY's request for authority to construct the Thousand Oaks and Ventura Alternate cell sites is granted.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is December 16, 1990.
