## RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION T-14406. LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF FOUR CELL SITES IN THE LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 96, FILED ON MARCH 27, 1991.

### <u>SUMMARY</u>

LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP (LASLP), by Advice Letter to the 96,4 filed on March 27, 1991, requests authority under the Addition provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add four cellular radiotelephone cell sites to its existing cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of four cell sites, known as the Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain sites located at 22025 Figueroa, Carson, CA, 3201 Pacific Coast Highway, Hermosa Beach, CA, 8228 Sunset Boulevard, West Hollywood, CA, and 9600 Sulphur Mountain Road, Ojai, CA, respectively. No protests to this Advice Letter have been filed.

#### BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

#### DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 96 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The four sites, Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain, represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in D.84-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LASLP has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the City of Carson, the City of Hermosa Beach, the City of West Hollywood, the County of Ventura, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

The proposed construction for the four cell sites will be located at 22025 Figueroa, Carson, CA, 3201 Pacific Coast Highway, Hermosa Beach, CA, 8228 Sunset Boulevard, West Hollywood, CA, and 9600 Sulpur Mountain Road, Ojai, CA and are known as the Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain sites, respectively. The Carson site will consist of an antennas mounted on a 50-foot monopole and an equipment shelter. The Hermosa Beach site will consist of antennas mounted to the top of an existing building and an equipment shelter. The West Hollywood site will consist of antennas mounted to the roof of an existing building and an equipment shelter. Finally, the Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain site will consist of antennas attached to an existing 50-foot wood utility pole.

The four cell sites, Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain, will become part of LASLP's cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area.

STATISTICS.

Public notice that LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 96 requesting authority to construct four cell sites, Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's March 29, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LASLP's Advice Letter No. 96 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

#### PROTESTS

No protests have been filed on LASLP's Advice Letter No. 96.

### FINDINGS

 On March 27, 1991, LOS ANGELES SMSA LINITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 96 requesting Executive authorization to construct four cell sites, Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain, located at 22025 Figueroa, Carson, CA, 3201
Pacific Coast Highway, Hermosa Beach, CA, 8228 Sunset Boulevard, West Hollywood, CA, and 9600 Sulpur Mountain Road, Ojai, CA respectively.

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- The Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain sites represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in D.84-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
- 3. Décisión 90-03-080 àdopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain réquiréments for the filing of ádvice letters requésting authorization to construct céllular radiotelephone facilities not describéd in autility's certificaté of constructs public convenience and necessity.
- 4. Advice Letter No. 96 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
- 5. A LASLP officer signed a declaration which states that LASLP has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 96.
- 6. Advice Letter No. 96 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Carson, Hermosa Beach, West Hollywood, and Ventura County-Sulphur Mountain cell sites: the City of Carson, the City of Hermosa Beach, the City of West Hollywood, the County of Ventura, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.
- 7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 96 have been received.
