R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14453. LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A CELL SITE IN THE LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 99, FILED ON APRIL 11, 1991.

SUMMARY

Los Angeles SMSA Limited Partnership (LASLP), by Advice Letter No. 99, filed on April 11, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add a new cellular radiotelephone cell site to its existing cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell site, known as the Sepulveda 2 site, located at 16000 Mulholland Drive, Los Angeles, CA. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 99 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The Sepulveda 2 site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in D.87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LASLP has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the

proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission); the City of Los Angeles, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

The proposed construction will be located at 16000 Mulholland Drive, Los Angeles, CA and is known as the Sepulveda 2 site. It will consist of the installation, maintenance, and use of an 8 foot by 35 foot modular telecommunications equipment shelter and a 45-foot-high monopole antenna.

The Sepulveda 2 site will become part of LASLP's cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area.

NOTICE

Public notice that Los Angeles SMSA Limited Partnership filed Advice Letter No. 99 requesting authority to construct the Sepulveda 2 site appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's April 15, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LASLP's Advice Letter No. 99 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been received to LASLP's Advice Letter No. 99.

FINDINGS

1. On April 11, 1991, Los Angeles SMSA Limited Partnership filed Advice Letter No. 99 requesting Executive authorization to construct the Sepulveda 2 cell site located at 16000 Mulholland Drive, Los Angeles, CA.
2. The Sepulveda 2 site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in D.87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 99 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.

5. A LASLP officer signed a declaration which states that LASLP has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 99.
6. Advice Letter No. 99 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Sepulveda 2 cell site: the City of Los Angeles, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 99 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) Los Angeles SMSA Limited Partnership's Advice Letter No. 99 is hereby approved.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is May 13, 1991.
