R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14491. SACRAMENTO CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A CELL SITE IN THE SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 56, FILED ON MAY 6, 1991.

SUMMARY

Sacramento Cellular Telephone Company (SCTC), by Advice Letter No. 56, filed on May 6, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add a new cellular radiotelephone cell site to its existing cellular system serving the Sacramento Metropolitan Statistical Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell site, known as the Capitol site, located at 1100 N Street, Sacramento, CA. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 56 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The Capitol site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in D.87-10-037, granting SCTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

SCTC has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise

all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission); the City of Sacramento, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

The proposed construction will be located at 1100 N Street, Sacramento, CA and is known as the Capitol site. It will consist of nine cellular antennas which will be mounted on the rooftop of an existing building. Radio transmitting/receiving equipment will be located the the basement of the existing building.

The Capitol site will become part of SCTC's cellular system serving the Sacramento Metropolitan Statistical Area.

NOTICE

Public notice that Sacramento Cellular Telephone Company filed Advice Letter No. 56 requesting authority to construct the Capitol site appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's May 10, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of SCTC's Advice Letter No. 56 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been received to SCTC's Advice Letter No. 56.

FINDINGS

1. On May 6, 1991, Sacramento Cellular Telephone Company filed Advice Letter No. 56 requesting Executive authorization to construct the Capitol cell site located at 1100 N Street, Sacramento, CA.
2. The Capitol site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in D.87-10-037, granting SCTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 56 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.

5. A SCTC officer signed a declaration which states that SCTC has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 56.
6. Advice Letter No. 56 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Capitol cell site: the City of Sacramento, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 56 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) Sacramento Cellular Telephone Company's Advice Letter No. 56 is hereby approved.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is June 6, 1991.
