R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14516. RANDOLPH CELLULAR LIMITED PARTNERSHIP DBA NORTH COAST CELLULAR. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A CELL SITE IN THE RURAL SERVICE AREA 1, ENCOMPASSING DEL NORTE, SISKIYOU, HUMBOLDT, AND TRINITY COUNTIES.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 8, FILED ON June 14, 1991.

SUMMARY

RANDOLPH CELLULAR LIMITED PARTNERSHIP DBA NORTH COAST CELLULAR (NCC), by Advice Letter No. 8, filed on June 14, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add a cellular radiotelephone cell site to its existing cellular system serving Rural Service Area 1, encompassing Del Norte, Siskiyou, Humboldt, and Trinity Counties. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell site, known as Antelope Mountain, located at Township 43, Range 7 W, Section 2, Assessor's parcel number 022-010-130-0. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

The Commission Advisory and Compliance Division has received all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in the Advice Letter No. 8 filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

Antelope Mountain represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in D.90-10-011, granting NCC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

NCC has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): Federal Communication Commission, Siskiyou County and the Bureau of Land Management, United States Department.

The proposed construction will be located at Township 43, Range 7 W, Section 2, Assessor's parcel number 022-010-130-0 and is known as Antelope Mountain. It will consist of a 128 square foot, one-story equipment shelter of wood and steel with alarm and fire suppression system. The antenna is type LPD 795N, it is a 92 degree sectored antenna side-mounted by steel frame on an existing tower at 80 feet above the ground.

The Antelope Mountain will become part of NCC's cellular system serving the Rural Service Area 1, encompassing Del Norte, Siskiyou, Humboldt, and Trinity Counties.

NOTICE

Public notice that RANDOLPH CELLULAR LIMITED PARTNERSHIP DBA NORTH COAST CELLULAR filed Advice Letter No. 8 requesting authority to construct Antelope Mountain appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's June 19, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of NCC's Advice Letter No. 8 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been received to NCC's Advice Letter No. 8.

FINDINGS

1. On June 14, 1991, RANDOLPH CELLULAR LIMITED PARTNERSHIP DBA NORTH COAST CELLULAR filed Advice Letter No. 8 requesting Executive authorization to construct Antelope Mountain located at Township 43, Range 7 W, Section 2, Assessor's parcel number 022-010-130-0.
2. The Antelope Mountain represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in 90-10-011, granting NCC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.



3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 8 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. A NCC officer signed a declaration which states that NCC has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 8.
6. Advice Letter No. 8 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Antelope Mountain: Federal Communications Commission, Siskiyou County and the Bureau of Land Management, United States Department of the Interior.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 8 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) RANDOLPH CELLULAR LIMITED PARTNERSHIP DBA NORTH COAST CELLULAR's Advice Letter No. 8 is hereby approved.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is July 15, 1991.
