RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION T-14566. BAY AREA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A CELL SITE IN THE SAN FRANCISCO/SAN JOSE CELLULAR GEOGRAPHIC SERVICE AREAS.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 96, FILED ON June 27, 1991.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

BAY AREA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY (BACTC), by Advice Letter No. 96, filed on June 27, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add a new cellular radiotelephone cell site to its existing cellular system serving the San Francisco/San Jose Cellular Geographic Service Areas. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell site, known as the Oyster Point cell site, located at 1000 Marina Boulevard, Brisbane, California 94005. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), à cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 96 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The Oyster Point cell site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in Decision 86-05-010, granting BACTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity. Resolution T-14566 Effective July 29, 1991 BACTC/A.L. No. 96/WSM

BACTC has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the Federal Aviation Administration, the Federal Communications Commission, and the City of Brisbane. e Ì

The proposed construction will be located at 1000 Marina Boulevard, Brisbane, California 94005 and is known as the Oyster Point cell site. It will consist of a 360 square foot equipment room which will be constructed in the ground floor garage of an existing office building. Six panel-type cellular antennas will be mounted on the roof of the office building, approximately 12 feet away from the parapet. Power will be supplied by an existing panel on the ground floor of the office building. Power will be fed through approximately 70 feet of cable from the existing panel to the equipment room.

The Oyster Point cell site will become part of BACTC's cellular system serving the San Francisco/San Jose Cellular Geographic Service Areas.

NOTICE

Public notice that BAY AREA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 96 requesting authority to construct the Oyster Point cell site appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's July 1, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of BACTC's Advice Letter No. 96 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been received to BACTC's Advice Letter No. 96.

FINDINGS

- 1. On June 27, 1991, BAY AREA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 96 requesting Executive authorization to construct the Oyster Point cell site located at 1000 Marina Boulevard, Brisbane, California 94005.
- The Oyster Point cell site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in Decision 86-05-010, granting BACTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

- 3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
- Advice Letter No. 96 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
- 5. A BACTC officer signed a declaration which states that BACTC has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 96.
- 6. Advice Letter No. 96 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Oyster Point cell site: the Federal Aviation Administration, the Federal Communications Commission, and the City of Brisbane.
- 7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 96 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- BAY AREA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY'S Advice Letter No. 96 is hereby approved.
