RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION T-14574. LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF 4 NEW CELL SITES IN THE LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 110, FILED ON JULY 29, 1991.

SUMMARY

LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP (LASLP), by Advice Letter No. 110, filed on July 29, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add 4 new cellular radiotelephone cell sites to its existing cellular system serving the LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA. This Resolution authorizes the construction of 4 new cell sites, known as the Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster sites, located at 611 Carondelet Street, Los Angeles, 2999 Overland Avenue, Los Angeles, 4041 Macarthur Blvd., Newport Beach, 7422 Garden Grove Blvd., Westminster, respectively. No protests to this Advice Letter have been filed.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 110 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

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The 4 new sites, Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster, represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in D. 87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LASLP has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the Federal Communication Commission, the Federal Aviation Administration, the City of Los Angeles, the City of Newport Beach, and the City of Westminster.

The proposed construction for the 4 new cell sites will be located at 611 Carondelet Street, Los Angeles, 2999 Overland Avenue, Los Angeles, 4041 Macarthur Blvd., Newport Beach, and 7422 Garden Grove Blvd., Westminster and are known as the Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster sites, respectively. The sites will consist of a 432 square foot cellular communications facility on the first floor of an existing six story parking garage, radio and power equipment, and microwave and cellular antennas on the face of the building (West Lake); a 600 square foot cellular communications facility on the second floor of an existing two story building, radio and power equipment, and microwave and cellular antennas attached to the penthouse of the building (Palms); a 510 square foot cellular communications facility on the second floor of an existing two story building, radio and power equipment, and cellular and microwave antennas on the penthouse (Jamboree); and an 8 x 35 foot equipment shelter, housing radio and power equipment and microwave and cellular antennas on a 60 foot monopole (Westminster).

The 4 new cell sites, Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster, will become part of LASLP's cellular system serving the LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA.

NOTICE

Public notice that LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 110 requesting authority to construct 4 new cell sites, Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's July 31, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LASLP's Advice Letter No. 110 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been filed on LASLP's Advice Letter No. 110.

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PINDINGS

- 1. On July 29, 1991, LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 110 requesting Executive authorization to construct 4 new cell sites, Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster, located at 611 Carondelet Street, Los Angeles, 2999 Overland Avenue, Los Angeles, 4041 Macarthur Blvd., Newport Beach, 7422 Garden Grove Blvd., Westminster, respectively.
- 2. The Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster sites represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in 87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
- 3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
- 4. Advice Letter No. 110 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
- 5. A LASLP officer signed a declaration which states that LASLP has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 110.
- 6. Advice Letter No. 110 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Westlake, Palms, Jamboree, and Westminster cell sites: the Federal Communication Commission, the Federal Aviation Administration, the City of Los Angeles, the City of Newport Beach, and the City of Westminster.
- 7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 110 have been received.

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THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP's réquest for authority to construct 4 new cell sites, Westlake, Palms, Jamborée, and Westminster, is granted.

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(2) The effective date of this resolution is August 29, 1991.
