R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14737. LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF TWO NEW CELL SITES IN THE LOS ANGELES STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 120, FILED ON NOVEMBER 12, 1991.

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SUMMARY

LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP (LASLP), by Advice Letter No. 120, filed on November 12, 1991, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add two new cellular radiotelephone cell sites to its existing cellular system serving the Los Angeles Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of two new cell sites, known as the Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway sites, located at (Del Mar) 345 Clinton St., Costa Mesa and (Redondo Beach Freeway) 1840 Wilmington Ave., Compton, respectively. No protests to this Advice Letter have been filed.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (Decision 90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 120 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The two new sites, Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway, represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in Decision 87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LASLP has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): Federal Aviation Administration, Federal Communications Commission, and for Delmar, the City of Costa Mesa, for Redondo Beach Freeway, the City of Compton.

The proposed construction for the two new cell sites will be located at (Del Mar) 345 Clinton St., Costa Mesa and (Redondo Beach Freeway) 1840 Wilmington Ave., Compton and are known as the Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway sites, respectively. The sites will consist of for Del Mar, a 60 foot monopole carrying three faces of cellular antennas and two microwave antennas, the conversion of a concrete block enclosure to an equipment building and the construction of a new trash enclosure at the same site; for Redondo Beach Freeway, a 60 ft. monopole bearing three faces of cellular antennas and two microwave antennas and an 8' x 35' equipment building

The two new cell sites, Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway, will become part of LASLP's cellular system serving the Los Angeles Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area.

#### NOTICE

Public notice that LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 120 requesting authority to construct two new cell sites, Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's November 15, 1991 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LASLP's Advice Letter No. 120 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

#### PROTESTS

No protests have been filed on LASLP's Advice Letter No. 120.

#### FINDINGS

1. On November 12, 1991, LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 120 requesting Executive authorization to construct two new cell sites, Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway, located at (Del Mar) 345 Clinton St., Costa Mesa and (Redondo Beach Freeway) 1840 Wilmington Ave., Compton, respectively.
2. The Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway sites represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described

in D.87-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 120 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. A LASLP officer signed a declaration which states that LASLP has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 120.
6. Advice Letter No. 120 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway cell sites: Federal Aviation Administration, Federal Communications Commission, and for Delmar, the City of Costa Mesa, for Redondo Beach Freeway, the City of Compton.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 120 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP's request for authority to construct two new cell sites, Del Mar and Redondo Beach Freeway, is granted.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is December 12, 1991.
