R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14812. LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF TWO NEW CELL SITES IN THE LOS ANGELES METROPOLITAN AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 125, FILED ON DECEMBER 31, 1992.

SUMMARY

LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP (LASLP), by Advice Letter No. 125, filed on December 31, 1992, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add two new cellular radiotelephone cell sites to its existing cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of two new cell sites, known as the Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback sites, located at Lot Number 104, Avalon, CA and 25260 La Paz Road, Laguna Hills, CA, respectively. No protests to this Advice Letter have been filed.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (Decision 90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 125 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The two new sites, Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback, represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in Decision 84-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LASLP has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the City of Avalon, the County of Orange, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.

The proposed construction for the two new cell sites will be located at Lot Number 104, Avalon, CA and 25260 La Paz Road, Laguna Hills, CA and are known as the Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback sites, respectively. The Avalon-Catalina Cable site will consist of two cellular antennas attached to an existing tower. The Laguna Hills-Saddleback site will consist of two cellular and microwave antennas mounted to the parapet of an existing building and a 500 square foot equipment shelter.

The two new cell sites, Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback, will become part of LASLP's cellular system serving the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area.

NOTICE

Public notice that LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 125 requesting authority to construct two new cell sites, Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's January 3, 1992 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LASLP's Advice Letter No. 125 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests have been filed on LASLP's Advice Letter No. 125.

FINDINGS

1. On December 31, 1992, LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP filed Advice Letter No. 125 requesting Executive authorization to construct two new cell sites, Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback, located at Lot Number 104, Avalon, CA and 25260 La Paz Road, Laguna Hills, CA, respectively.
2. The Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback sites represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in 84-04-014, granting LASLP a certificate of public convenience and necessity.



3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. Advice Letter No. 125 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. A LASLP officer signed a declaration which states that LASLP has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 125.
6. Advice Letter No. 125 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback cell sites: the City of Avalon, the County of Orange, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Communications Commission.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 125 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) LOS ANGELES SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP's request for authority to construct two new cell sites, Avalon-Catalina Cable and Laguna Hills-Saddleback, is granted.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is January 31, 1992.
