R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-14870. LOS ANGELES CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ADDITION OF A CELL SITE IN THE LOS ANGELES CELLULAR GEOGRAPHIC SERVICE AREA.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 223, FILED ON JANUARY 31, 1992.

SUMMARY

LOS ANGELES CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY (LACTC), by Advice Letter No. 223, filed on January 31, 1992, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to add a cellular radiotelephone cell site to its existing cellular system serving the Los Angeles Cellular Geographic Service Area. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell site, known as the "LACTC #167" site, located at 1630 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

Advice Letter No. 223 contains all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an Advice Letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

The "LACTC #167" site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in Decision 84-06-110, granting LACTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

LACTC has obtained permits or approvals from the following governmental entities and asserts that these entities comprise all governmental entities that have jurisdiction over the proposed construction (with the exception of the California Public Utilities Commission): the Federal Communications Commission and the City of Long Beach.

The proposed construction will be located at 1630 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach and is known as the "LACTC #167" site. It will consist of 12 Antel-type antennas will be attached to the dome off the roof, communications equipment will be placed in a 360 square foot space of an existing commercial building.

The "LACTC #167" site will become part of LACTC's cellular system serving the Los Angeles Cellular Geographic Service Area.

NOTICE

Public notice that LOS ANGELES CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 223 requesting authority to construct the "LACTC #167" site appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's February 5, 1992 Daily Calendar. In addition, copies of LACTC's Advice Letter No. 223 were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

PROTESTS

No protests to LACTC's Advice Letter No. 223 have been received.

FINDINGS

1. On January 31, 1992, LOS ANGELES CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY filed Advice Letter No. 223 requesting Executive authorization to construct "LACTC #167" site located at 1630 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach.
2. The "LACTC #167" site represents an additional cellular radiotelephone facility not described in Decision 84-06-110, granting LACTC a certificate of public convenience and necessity.
3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.



4. Advice Letter No. 223 conforms to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. A LACTC officer signed a declaration which states that LACTC has received all necessary permits or approvals from the governmental entities listed in Advice Letter No. 223.
6. Advice Letter No. 223 lists the following entities which have jurisdiction over the proposed construction of the "LACTC #167" site: the Federal Communications Commission and the City of Long Beach.
7. No protests to Advice Letter No. 223 have been received.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) LOS ANGELES CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY's Advice Letter No. 223 is hereby approved.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is March 2, 1992.
