R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-15019. SATELLITE BUSINESS SYSTEMS.
REQUEST TO HAVE ITS CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE
AND NECESSITY REVOKED.

BY ADVICE LETTER 200, FILED ON JUNE 1, 1992.

SUMMARY

Satellite Business Systems (U-5013-C), by Advice Letter No. 200, dated June 1, 1992, requests authority under the provisions of General Order 96-A, Section XIV, to withdraw from service as an Interexchange Carrier.

BACKGROUND

Satellite Business Systems (SBS) was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) by Decision (D.) 84-01-037 on January 3, 1984 to operate as a nondominant interexchange carrier (NDIEC). Since that time, D.85-12-100 transferred ownership of the carrier to International Business Machines (IBM) and D.86-02-019 transferred it again to MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI).

MCI has transferred all of SBS's customers to similar MCI services; therefore, no customer will be affected by SBS's withdrawal of service.

PROTESTS

Notice of this Advice Letter appeared on the Commission's Daily Calendar on June 4, 1992. No protests of the Advice Letter have been filed.

DISCUSSION

Under General order 96-A, Section XIV, a utility may not withdraw from service without Commission authorization. Section XIV reads as follows:

"No public utility of a class specified herein shall, unless authority has been obtained from the Commission, either withdraw entirely from public service or withdraw

from public service in any portion of the territory served."

Satellite Business Systems properly requested that authorization through the filing of Advice Letter No. 200.

FINDINGS


1. Satellite Business Systems (SBS) was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and necessity to operate as a nondominant interexchange carrier in Decision 84-01-037.
2. Satellite Business Systems submitted Advice letter No. 200 requesting authority to withdraw from service as a nondominant interexchange carrier.
3. Satellite Business Systems has no customers. All its former customers have been transferred to MCI with similar tariff services to the SBS offerings.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity previously granted to Satellite Business Systems is revoked.
2. A copy of this resolution shall be placed in the Commission's formal files for Application Nos. 83-10-009, 85-11-002, and 85-11-020. These files include the original filing for certification and the two transfers of ownership.
3. Satellite Business Systems' nondominant interexchange carrier tariffs are cancelled. The CPUC Corporate Identification Number U-5013-C is also cancelled and will not be reissued.

The effective date of this resolution is today.
