R E S O L U T I O N  
EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE  
CONSTRUCTION OF CELLULAR RADIOTELEPHONE FACILITIES IN

SUMMARY

The cellular radiotelephone facilities attached, have requested provisions of General Order 159 (March 28, 1995) for construction of cellular radiotelephone facilities in accordance with General Order 159. This Resolution authorizes the construction of these facilities at the sites as specified in the attached letter.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D. 1995), authorization from the Commission is required for the construction of cellular facilities. Public utility companies must file an application with the Commission for authorization to construct after it has been determined that the construction is in the public interest and that the Commission has jurisdiction over the proposed construction. The Commission must obtain jurisdiction over the proposed construction in order to grant authorization to construct. R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION T-15891. EXECUTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING THE  
CONSTRUCTION OF CELLULAR RADIOTELEPHONE FACILITIES IN  
ACCORDANCE WITH GENERAL ORDER 159.

SUMMARY

The cellular radiotelephone utilities specified in Schedule A, attached, have requested authority by advice letter under the provisions of General Order 159 (G.O. 159) and Decision No. 90-03-080 (March 28, 1990) to construct or modify cellular radiotelephone facilities in the utility's existing cellular system. This Resolution authorizes the construction of the cell sites as specified in Schedule A, attached. No protests to these Advice Letters have been received.

BACKGROUND

Under G.O. 159 (D.90-03-080), a cellular utility must obtain authorization from the Commission before construction of cellular facilities not described in the decision granting the certificate of public convenience and necessity. A cellular utility must file an advice letter requesting authorization to construct after it has received all approvals for the proposed construction required by any governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the proposed construction, or which would have jurisdiction absent the Commission's preemption.

DISCUSSION

The advice letters specified in Schedule A, attached, contain all the information required under G.O. 159 to be included in an advice letter filing for authority to construct additional cellular facilities.

These sites, described in Schedule A, attached, represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in the Commission Decision granting the respective utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity, or modifications of existing cellular facilities.

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In filing these advice letters, the respective utilities attest that all necessary permits or approvals have been obtained from all governmental entities having jurisdiction over the proposed construction (other than the California Public Utilities Commission), as specified in Schedule A.

#### NOTICE

Public notice of the filing of these advice letters appeared in the California Public Utilities Commission's Daily Calendar on the dates specified in Schedule A, attached. In addition, copies of the advice letter were mailed in accordance with the Commission's General Order No. 96-A, Section III. G, to competing utilities either privately or publicly owned, adjacent utilities either privately or publicly owned, other utilities having requested such notification, and other interested parties having requested such notification.

#### PROTESTS

No protests of these advice letters have been received by the Commission Advisory and Compliance Division.

#### FINDINGS

1. Schedule A, attached, lists advice letters filed with the Commission requesting Executive authorization to construct or modify cellular radiotelephone facilities.
2. These sites represent additional cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in the Commission Decision granting the respective utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity, or modifications to existing cellular facilities.
3. Decision 90-03-080 adopts G.O. 159 which sets forth certain requirements for the filing of advice letters requesting authorization to construct cellular radiotelephone facilities not described in a utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity.
4. These advice letters conform to the requirements of Decision 90-03-080 and G.O. 159.
5. For each listed utility, an officer has signed a declaration which states that the utility has received all necessary permits or approvals from all governmental entities having jurisdiction over the proposed construction (except for the Commission).
6. No protests to these advice letters have been received.

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THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- (1) The Advice Letters specified in Schedule A, attached, are hereby approved.
- (2) The effective date of this resolution is May 23, 1996.
