RESOLUTION

GRANTING A SECOND EXTENSION OF TIME TO COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION OF GOLDEN VALLEY ROAD ACROSS THE TRACKS OF THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY'S EL PASO MAIN LINE IN SANTA CLARITA, LOS ANGELES COUNTY.

By letter dated November 20, 1990, Los Angeles County (County) requests a time extension from December 14, 1990 to December 14, 1992 to comply with the provisions of Decision (D.) 86-11-059, dated November 14, 1986, in Application (A.) 86-04-008, which authorized construction of Golden Valley road atgrade across the Southern Pacific Transportation Company's (SPT) El Paso Main Line, identified as Crossing B-447.1, in Santa Clarita, Los Angeles County. An extension of time was previously granted by Resolution TED-16 on May 19, 1989.

County advises that an agreement between the developer, County and SPT has recently been executed and the project will now be completed.

SPT has indicated it has no objections to the requested extension of time. The staff finds that there has been no substantial change of circumstances since the original authority was granted by Commission decision.

IT IS RESOLVED that the County of Los Angeles is granted an extension of time until December 14, 1992, to exercise the authority granted by D.86-11-059 in A.86-04-008. In all other respects, D.86-11-059 shall remain in full force and effect.

This resolution is issued pursuant to Resolution ET-1367 and memorandum by the Executive Director dated April 6, 1988, and is effective today, January 10, 1991
