R E S O L U T I O N

GRANTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION OF RIO VISTA ROAD UNDER THE TRACKS OF THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY'S EL PASO MAIN LINE IN SANTA CLARITA, LOS ANGELES COUNTY.

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By letter dated March 1, 1991, City of Santa Clarita (City) requests an extension of time to comply with the provisions of Decision (D.) 88-03-033, dated March 9, 1988, in Application (A.) 87-07-010, which authorized construction of Rio Vista Road at separated grades under the tracks of Southern Pacific Transportation Company's (SPT) El Paso Main Line, identified as Crossing B-449.24-B, in Santa Clarita, Los Angeles County.


City advises that there has been a delay in funding of the grade separation, but now it appears that the matter has been resolved. City has requested a three year extension of time, however, Resolution ET-1367 permits only a two year time extension, which we will grant. The City may file for additional time in the future if additional time is required to complete the grade separation project. Such a further request will be evaluated in view of the situation and standards in existence at that time.

Los Angeles County Department of Public Works acted on the city's behalf when filing A.87-07-010, and has no objection to the time extension. SPT also has no objection to granting of the time extension. The Commission staff finds that there have been no substantial change in circumstances since the granting of the original authority.

IT IS RESOLVED that the City of Santa Clarita is granted a two year extension of time from April 8, 1991 to April 8, 1993, to exercise the authority granted by D.88-03-033 in A.87-07-010. In all other respects, D.88-03-033 shall remain in full force and effect.

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This resolution is issued pursuant to Resolution ET-1367 and memorandum by the Executive Director dated April 6, 1988, and is effective today, March 25, 1991.
