R E S O L U T I O N

GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME FOR THE TEMPORARY
MODIFICATION OF CROSSING PROTECTION DURING CON-
STRUCTION AT EIGHT RAILROAD CROSSINGS AT-GRADE IN LA
MESA, SAN DIEGO COUNTY


By letter dated December 16, 1988 the San Diego Metropolitan Transit Development Board (MTDB) requested an extension of time to March 15, 1989 to comply with Resolution ET-1380 dated July 22, 1988 which authorized temporary flagging (90 days) of eight crossings during widening and improvement of the street approaches. MTDB cites the fact that the extension of time is required because portions of the El Cajon LRT Project construction program, including final testing of the automatic crossing protection equipment has been unavoidably delayed and is now scheduled for testing in late February 1989. It is proposed to continue flagging of the crossings listed below until the automatic protection is fully operational:

The San Diego & Imperial Valley Railroad Company (SD&IV) has indicated that it has no objection to the requested extension of time. The Commission staff finds that there has been no substantial change in circumstances since the original authority was granted by Commission resolution.

IT IS RESOLVED that the San Diego Metropolitan Transit Development Board is granted an extension of time until March 15, 1989 to continue flagging the eight crossings listed above, which authority was granted by Resolution ET-1380 dated July 22, 1988. In all other respects, Resolution ET-1380 shall remain in full force and effect.

This resolution is issued pursuant to Resolution ET-1367 and memorandum by the Executive Director dated April 6, 1988, and is effective today, JANUARY 18, 1989.
