RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO REINSTATE HIGHWAY CARRIER CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY WHICH HAVE BEEN REVOKE FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH STATUTORY PROVISIONS OR COMMISSION ORDERS

Resolution 18089, dated September 3, 1980 which authorized the Executive Director to take certain certificate action is hereby rescinded.

By this resolution, the Executive Director is authorized to reinstate highway carrier certificates of public convenience and necessity which have been revoked for failure to:

- 1. File quarterly reports of gross operating revenue.
- Pay Transportation Rate Fund Fees and/or Uniform Business License Taxes and/or penalties due thereon.
- 3. File evidence of adequate public liability and property damage, and/or workers's compensation.
- Respond to requests for information.
- 5. File special or Annual Financial Reports.
- 6. Pay a fine previously imposed for failure to respond to a request for information.

Reinstatement will be effected upon the carrier's written demonstration of mitigating circumstances and payment of a reinstatement fee of \$125.00.
