

RESOLUTION GRANTING JANET LEE BOOKER, dba ARNOLD SHUTTLE SERVICE, ROUTE REVISION DOCKET REQUEST TO ADD TOWN OF SAN ANDREAS TO ITS ROUTE FROM TOWN OF ARNOLD.

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Janet Lee Booker (Petitioner) (PSC-7077) is a passenger stage corporation serving the town of Arnold and cities and towns within a 50 miles radius.

Petitioner proposes to add town of San Andreas to its route because of public requests for transportation to the Mark Twain St. Joseph's Hospital located there. San Andreas is within the 50 miles radius of Arnold.

Notice of this request appeared in the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar of August 2, 1991. No protests were received.

Since this requested service is urgently needed and there is no other public transportation available, petitioner may file tariffs, timetables, and establish service on the effective date of this resolution.


