R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION DENYING ISSUANCE OF CHARTER-PARTY CARRIER AUTHORITY AND HIGHWAY CARRIER AUTHORITY (INCLUDING AUTHORITY TO OPERATE AS A HOUSEHOLD GOODS CARRIER) FOR FAILURE TO SATISFY STATUTORY PROVISIONS OF THE PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE AND COMMISSION GENERAL ORDERS

The Commission finds that each of the applicants on the attached schedule has failed to meet one or more of the following requirements, and concludes that the types of authority applied for should be denied.

1. Pay regulatory fees and taxes owed as a prior holder of authority.

5. Comply with highway safety requirements.
