
R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION DENYING ISSUANCE OF CHARTER-PARTY CARRIER AUTHORITY
OR HOUSEHOLD GOODS CARRIER AUTHORITY FOR FAILURE TO SATISFY
STATUTORY PROVISIONS OF THE PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE AND COMMISSION
GENERAL ORDERS

The Commission finds that each of the applicants for a charter-party carrier certificate or household goods carrier permit shown on the attached schedule has failed to meet one or more of the following requirements, and concludes that the type of authority applied for should be denied.

1. Pay regulatory fees and taxes owed as a prior holder of authority.
2. File evidence of adequate public liability and property damage, workers' compensation, and/or cargo insurance.
3. Respond to requests for information.
4. Redeem dishonored check submitted in payment of application filing fee.
5. Comply with highway safety requirements.
6. Comply with the controlled substance and alcohol testing certification program adopted by the Commission for charter-party carriers.
