RESOLUTION NO. W-3413 October 26, 1988

#### RESOLUTION

(RES. W-3413) BIG BASIN SANITATION COMPANY (SEMER) (BESC). ORDER AUTHORIZING A GENERAL RATE INCREASE PRODUCING \$3,236 OR 84.8% ADDITIONAL ANNUAL REVENUE.

RRSC, by draft advice letter accepted by the Water Utilities Branch (Branch) on August 18, 1988, requested authority under Section VI of General Order (G.O.) 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase rates for sewer service by \$3,384 or 88.7%. BRSC estimates that 1989 gross revenue of \$3,816 at present rates would increase to \$7,200 at proposed rates and would produce a rate of return on rate base of 4.23%. BRSC serves 24 residential flat rate sewer customers in an unincorporated area known as Big Basin Woods Subdivision approximately three miles northeast of Boulder Creek in Santa Cruz County.

The present rates became effective July 16, 1985 pursuant to Resolution W-3248 dated June 21, 1985 which authorized a general rate increase.

The Branch made an independent analysis of BBSC's summary of earnings. BBSC is a division of Big Basin Water Company which provides water service to BBSC's sewer customers and about 475 others in an adjacent area. Decision (D.)88-08-020 granted the water company a general rate increase on August 10, 1988. Most of BBSC's expense estimates were derived either from figures adopted by D.88-08-020 or Resolution W-3248, with escalation to 1989 for inflation. Appendix A shows BBSC's and the Branch's estimated summary of earnings at present, proposed and adopted rates.

BBSC and the Branch differ only in their estimates of purchased power; all other differences are minor and result from the purchased power estimates.

The Branch's figure for purchased power is lower than BBSC's. BBSC based its estimate on recorded power consumption for the first five months of 1988 annualized for the entire year. The Branch noted that power use decreased significantly when one of two effluent pumps was overhauled in July, 1988; the other pump was last overhauled in 1985. The Branch used the average recorded power consumption from 1984 to 1987 and the latest power rates effective May 17, 1988 as the basis for its estimate.

The Branch's estimates for income taxes reflect current tax rates under the federal Tax Reform Act of 1986 and the corresponding state rates for 1989.

Almost all of BBSC's plant was contributed many years ago, most of it before BBSC came under Commission jurisdiction in 1972. Records of the historical cost of contributed plant are not available, so the Branch has shown it as zero in Appendix A. This treatment has no effect on rate base.

BBSC's draft advice letter requested rates which it estimated would produce a rate of return on rate base of 4.23%. After Branch's adjustments, the resulting summary of earnings at BBSC's proposed rates shows a rate of return of 13.96%. The Branch recommends a rate of return of 10.50%, the midpoint of the 10.25% to 10.75% standard rate of return range recommended by the Accounting and Financial Branch of the Commission Advisory and Compliance Division for small 100% equity financed water utilities.

BBSC was informed of the Branch's differing views of expenses and rate of return and has stated that it accepts the Branch's estimates.

A notice of the proposed rate increase and public meeting was mailed to each customer on August 23, 1988. No letters of protest have been received.

Two engineers from the Branch and several representatives from BBSC were available at a public neeting in Boulder Creek on September 15, 1988. No members of the public or customers attended the neeting.

Branch engineers conducted a field investigation of BESC's service area on September 15, 1988, checking visible portions of the system and reviewing methods of operation. BESC's records were inspected during an earlier visit on August 25, 1988. The investigation revealed that service is satisfactory. No major problems were found.

There are no outstanding Commission orders requiring system improvements. According to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Coast Region, BBSC's operations meet all applicable standards.

BBSC currently charges all customers a \$13.25 ronthly flat rate. At the Branch's recommended rate shown in Appendix B, the monthly bill for all customers would increase from \$13.25 to \$24.50.

The Branch recommends that the Commission authorize an increase in gross revenue of \$3,236 or 84.8%. This increase provides a 10.50% estimated rate of return on rate base in test year 1989.

### FINDINGS

- 1. The Branch's recommended summary of earnings (Appendix A) is reasonable and should be adopted.
- 2. The rate recommended by the Branch (Appendix B) is reasonable and should be authorized.
- 3. The quantities (Appendix D) used to develop the Branch's recommendations are reasonable and should be adopted.
- 4. The rate increase authorized herein is justified and the resulting rate is just and reasonable.

#### IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Authority is granted under Public Utilities Code Section 454 for Big Basin Sanitation Company to file an advice letter incorporating the summary of earnings and revised rate schedule attached to this resolution as Appendices A and B respectively, and concurrently to cancel its presently effective rate Schedule No. 1. Its filing shall comply with General Order 96-A. The effective date of the revised rate schedule shall be the date of filing.
- 2. This resolution is effective today.
