### RESOLUTION

#### (RES. W-3480) BUHL WATER SYSTEM (BNS). ORDER AUTHORIZING AN OFFSET RATE INCREASE PRODUCING \$3,282 OR 12.01 ADDITIONAL ANNUAL REVENUE

By Advice Letter No. 16 filed December 7, 1989, BNS requests authority under Section VI of General Order 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase rates to offset: (1) a \$1,760 increase in plant for the installation of production measuring devices (\$302 additional annual revenue requirement), and (2) a \$2,980 increase in water testing costs (\$2,980additional annual revenue requirement). BNS serves 205 flat rate customers in an unincorporated area located 3 miles southwest of the City of Visalia, Tulare County.

The present rates became effective February 24, 1988, pursuant to Resolution No. W-3386 dated February 24, 1988, which authorized a general rate increase, found a rate of return on rate base of 10.50% for 1987 reasonable, and ordered BAS to comply with General Order 103, "Rules Governing Water Service Including Minimum Standards for Design and Construction," by installing a suitable measuring device or otherwise determining production at each source of supply. The Branch subsequently inspected BAS's system and confirmed that measuring devices have been installed as ordered. The Branch examined BAS's workpapers submitted with the draft of the Advice Letter and determined that \$2,980 is the proper amount for the increase in water testing costs. This offset will not result in a rate of return greater than last authorized.

BWS notified its customers of the proposed increase by a separate mailing on December 5, 1989. No protests or other customer correspondence were received.

BWS's service is satisfactory. There are no outstanding Commission orders requiring system improvements.

BWS's multiple sources of water and boosting facility together provide ample water supply. No additional water conservation measures are needed at this time.

Since the entire amount of the increase is not dependent on the quantity of water used, the entire increase is applied to the service charge part of metered rates and to the flat rate charges as a constant percentage increase.



There are no metered customers presently; however, BNS maintains a metered schedule which enables BNS to meter a customer should there be need to do so.

A corparison of present and proposed rates is shown below:

At the proposed rates, the monthly bill for the single-family flat rate customer will increase from \$10.90 to \$12.20 per month or 11.9%.

After investigation by the Water Utilities Branch, the Commission finds that the requested rate increase hereby authorized is justified, and that the resulting rates are reasonable.

THE COMMISSION FINDS that the requested rate increase is justified, and the resulting rates hereby authorized are reasonable.

IT IS ORDERED that Buhl Water System is authorized, on the effective date herein, to make effective revised Schedules Nos. 1,2R, UF, and the Table of Contents attached to Advice Letter No. 16 and to cancel the presently effective rates schedules for water service.

This resolution is effective today.
