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(RES . W-3587), DOMINGUEZ WATER CORPORATION (DWC) ORDER AUTHORIZING AN OPFSET RATE INCREASE PRODUCING ADDITIONAL ANNUAL REVENUES OF $\$ 1.578 .000$ OR 11.38.

## BACKGROUND

By Advice Letter 146, filed May 17, 1991, DHC requested authority under Section VI of General Order $96-A$ and Section 454 of the Public Utilities code to increase rates for water service to offset: (1) a $\$ 476,970$ increase in pumped water replenishment tax (from Central and Hest Basin Replenishment Districts), (2) a $\$ 68,841$ increase in purchased power costs (from Southern California Edison Company), (3) a $\$ 1,026,990$ increase in purchased water costs from Ketropolitan Water District, and (4) a $\$ 4,718$ increase in uncollectibles due to DWC's higher level of billings. DWC serves about 31,500 metered customers in portions of the cities of Long Beach, Los Angeles, Torrance, Carson, Compton and unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County.

The present rates became effective January 1, 1989, pursuant to Decision No. 87-01-064, dated January 28, 1987, which authorized a $\$ 693,300$ or 5.23 increase in 1987 and $\$ 770,800$ or 5.78 increase in 1988.

## DISCUSSION

The offset increase requested herein is for the purpose of recovering in rates, on a dollar for dollar basis, changes in items that have occurred since the present rates became effective. This rate rate increase will not result in a rate of return greater than previously authorized.

To determine if purchased power is being used efficiently, the Water Utilities Branch reviewed the latest avallable pump efficiency tests and found the results satisfactory.

Service is satisfactory. There are no commission orders requiring system improvements, nor are there significant service problems reguiring corrective actions.

To promote water conservation, DWC has requested its customers, through bill inserts and distribution of conservation material, to reduce their water consumption. In addition, DWC has in effect a mandatory water conservation and rationirg plan as authorized by the

Commission in Resolution No. W-3565 (dated May 8, 1991), which presently calls for a 208 reduction in customers' use from 1989 levels.

The increase will result in a $\$ 1.65$ per month or $11.1 \%$ increase for the typical residential customer. The monthly bill will increase from $\$ 14.90$ to $\$ 16.55$ for an average water use of 1,500 cubic-feet per month.

## RATE DESIGN

The increases which are results of changes in costs of purchased water and power are related to water consumption and are applied to the quantity block for general metered service.

## NOTICE AND PROTEST

DWi mailed a notice of this increase to each customer on May 28, 1991. No protests or correspondence have been received.

FINDINGS
THE COMMISSION FINDS, after investigation by the Branch, that the rate increase hereby authorized is justified, and the resulting rate is just and reasonable.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Dominguez Water Corporation is authorized to make effective, five (5) days after the effective date of this resolution, revised Schedule Nos. 1, General Metered Service, and No. 3M, Metered Irrigation Service attached to Advice Letter No. 146 and to cancel the presently effective Schedule Nos. 1 and $3 M$ for water service.
2. Dominguez Water Corporation is directed to maintain fits balancing account as required by the Public Utilities Code Section 792.5.
3. This resolution is effective today.
