FESOLUTION

(RESOLUTION W-3616) CENTRAL WATER SYSTEM (CWS) ORDER AUTHORIZING A GENERAL RATE INCREASE PRODUCING ADDITIONAL ANNUAL REVENUE OF \$5,544 (100.0%) IN 1992 AND \$3,024 (27.3%) IN 1993.

SUMMARY

This Resolution grants an increase in gross annual revenue of \$5,544, or 100.0% for test year 1992 and \$3,024, or 27.3% for test year 1993. These increases will provide a 2.59% rate of return on rate base in test year 1992 and a 10.88% rate of return in 1993.

BACKGROUND

CWS, by draft advice letter accepted by the Water Utilities Branch (Branch) on January 24, 1991 requests authority under Section VI of General Order (G.O.) 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase rates for water service by \$5,328 or 100.0% in 1992 and by \$2,906 or 27.3% in 1993. The increase is spread over two years in order not to exceed the maximum permitted under the Commission's CAPS policy adopted in 1982 which limits Class D water utilities to a 100% rate increase in any one year. CWS's request shows 1992 gross revenue of \$5,328 at present rates increasing to \$10,656 in 1992 at proposed rates to produce a rate of return on rate base of 3.39%. Its request also shows 1993 gross revenue of \$10,656 increasing to \$13,562 in 1993 at 1993 proposed rates to produce a rate of return on rate base of 12.78%.

CWS presently serves 42 customers in the unincorporated community of Plainview, eight miles northwest of Porterville in Tulare County.

The present rates became effective on February 24, 1982 pursuant to Resolution No. W-2937 dated February 17, 1982, which authorized a general rate increase producing \$1,840 or 49.9% additional annual revenue.

DISCUSSION

The Branch assisted CWS in preparing its request for a rate relief under the Branch's outreach program. CWS did not request an allowance for income taxes, however, income tax expense is included in the Branch estimates. CWS agrees with this and other Branch estimates. Appendix A shows the estimated summary of earnings at present, requested, and adopted rates for test years 1992 and 1993.

Inspection of CWS's service territory noted that it has only one well supplying water. General Order No. 103, "Rules Governing Water Service Including Minimum Standards for Design and Construction." requires that each separately operated water system shall have not less than two independent sources of supply.

CWS should obtain a second source of supply. It should consider drilling and equipping an additional well along with other options such as interconnection with another water purveyor. CWS should be required to prepare and submit for Branch approval an analysis of alternatives before proceeding with construction.

CWS has no outstanding Commission orders requiring system improvement. The Tulare County Department of Health Services has indicated that CWS water meets all primary and secondary drinking water standards currently in effect.

CWS has filed rate schedules for flat-rate service and general metered-rate service. All customers presently receive service under Schedule No. 2, Flat Rate Service. The Branch recommends that the flat rate schedule be increased by the system average increase.

The Branch also recommends that the metered rate schedule be revised to conform to the Commission's metered rate design policy established by Decision No. 86-05-064. The recommended metered schedule has service charges which would recover 50% of CWS's fixed costs and a single quantity rate which would recover the balance. The customer charges would be approximately the same under the metered-rate schedule as under the flat-rate schedule for a customer who uses an average of 16 Ccf per month (one Ccf is one hundred cubic feet).

In reviewing CWS's other filed tariff schedules, the Branch found that the title page and preliminary statement contain outdated information and should be revised. Rule 12, Rates and Optional Rates; Rule 14, Shortage of Supply and Interruption of Delivery; Rule 18, Meter Tests and Adjustment of Bills for Meter Error; Rule 19, Service to Separate Premises and Multiple Units, and Resale of Water; Rule 20, Water Conservation; and Rule 21, Fire Protection; should also be revised to reflect current conditions.

At the Branch's recommended rates shown in Appendix B, the bill for residential flat-rate customer would increase from \$11.00 to \$22.00 per month for test year 1992 and to \$28.00 for test year 1993.

NOTICE AND PROTESTS

A notice of the proposed rate increase was mailed to each customer on January 8, 1991. No letters protesting the increase were received by the Branch. The Commission's Consumer Affairs Branch has not received any informal complaints involving CWS in the last three years.

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A public meeting was held on January 24, 1991 in the home of one of the customers in the service area. The Branch representative explained Commission rate setting procedures, and the utility owner explained the need for the rate increase and service improvements it proposed to make. Five customers attended the meeting and expressed understanding for the need to increase rates but were concerned over the the magnitude of the increase at this time.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

1. The Branch's recommended summary of earnings (Appendix A) is reasonable and should be adopted.

2. The rates recommended by the Branch (Appendix B) are reasonable and should be adopted.

3. The quantities (Appendix C) used to develop the Branch's recommendations are reasonable and should be adopted.

4. The rate increase authorized herein is justified and the resulting rates are just and reasonable.

5. CWS should be ordered to comply with G.O. 103 by installing or otherwise obtaining an additional water supply source. CWS should prepare an analysis of all options for meeting this requirement and submit it to the Branch for approval prior to beginning any construction work.

6. CWS's tariffs have outdated sheets. They are the title page, preliminary statement, and Rules No. 12, 14, 18, 19, 20, and 21. These should be revised.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Authority is granted under Public Utilities Code Section 454 for Central Water System to file an advice letter incorporating the summary of earnings and revised rate schedules attached to this resolution as Appendix A and B respectively; concurrently to cancel its presently effective rate Schedules No. 1, and 2; and file the tariff revisions noted in Finding No. 6. Its filing shall comply with General Order No. 96-A. The effective date of the revised schedules shall be five (5) days after the date of filing.

2. Central Water System shall install or otherwise obtain an additional water supply source within one year of the effective date of this order. Central Water System shall submit an analysis of alternatives to the Water Utilities Branch for approval prior to commencing any construction work to comply with this requirement.

3. This resolution is effective today.
