RESOLUTION
(RES. H-3622), SOUTHENN CALIFORNIA WATER COMPANY (SONC), ORANGK OOUNY DISTRICT. CRIER AUIHORIZING AN OFFSET RATE IRKREASE FPOUUCING $\$ 949,500$ OR 9.61\% ADDITIUNAL, ANRKAL, REVEXTE.

## BNCTEROUND

By Advice Letter 847-H, flled october 7, 1991, SCWC requests authority under Section VI of General Onder $96-$ A and Section 454 of the Rublic utilities code to increase rates to offset: (1) a $\$ 527,900$ increase in purchased water costs, (2) $\$ 9,700$ in related increases in unoollectibles and franchise requirements, and (3) $\$ 411,900$ in the undercollection in the balancing acoount. SCWC serves approximately 36,000 metered customers in its orange County District.

The present rates became effective on Jarmary 1, 1990, pursuant to Decision Ho. 89-11-017.

## DISOLSSICN

The offset increase requested herein is for the purpose of recovering in rates, on a dollar-for-dollar basis, changes in itens that have oocurned since the present rates became effectlve. This rate increase will not result in a retum greater than that previously authorized.

The reason for the $\$ 527,900$ increase in purchased water costs is due to increases in purchased hater changes from the following agencies: (a) Numicipal Water District of orange county from $\$ 232$ to $\$ 263$ per acre-foot (AF), (b) East Orange Water District from $\$ 244$ to $\$ 263$ per AF, (c) Orange County Water District from $\$ 45$ to $\$ 51$ per AF, (d) Red Hill Water Compamy fron $\$ 0.387 / A F$ to $\$ 168.58$ per $A F$, and (e) the replenishment cost of the orange County Water District from $\$ 45$ to $\$ 51$ per AF.

The requested expense offset will result in a $\$ 0.045 /$ ocf increase in the quantity rate. one off is one hundred cubic feet. Due to an underoollection of $\$ 809,200$ in the balancing acoount, a surcharge of $\$ 0.035 / 00$ f will be added to the quantity rates for 24 months.

To detemine if purchased power is being used efficiently, the Branch reviewed the latest pump efficiency tests and found the results to be satisfactory.

Service is satisfactory. There are no commission onders reguiring system improvements at this time.

To promote conservation, sci has requested its customers, through bill inserts and distribution of conservation material, to reduce their water consumption.

This increase will result in a $\$ 1.99$ per month or $10.78 \%$ increase for the average customer on a $5 / 8 \times 3 / 4$-inch meter. The average monthly bill will increase from $\$ 18.46$ to $\$ 20.45$ for average users who use 25 cf per month.

WITE AND PROTEST
Sci has given public notice of the request for increase by publishing in the local newspapers on october 10 and october 14, 1991. One customer protest letter has been received. Staff has reviewed and responded to the protest.

## FINDINGS

The Commission finds, after investigation by the Branch, that the rate increase hereby authorized is justified, and the resulting rate is just and reasonable.

## IT IS CRORED that:

1. Southern California Gater Company is authorized, five days after the effective date herein, to make effective revised Schechules HFos . OC-1, OCH-1, and $0 C-3 M$, attached to Advice Letter $847-\mathrm{N}$, and concurrently to cancel its presently effective rate Schedules $N O s . O C-1, O C H-1$, and $O C-3 M$.
2. Souther California Faker Company is directed to maintain its balancing account as required by Public Utilities Code Section 792.5.
3. This resolution is effective today.
