RESOLUTION

(RES. W-3910), TAHOE CEDARS WATER COMPANY (TOWC).
ORDER AUTHORIZING AN OFFSET RATE INCREASE PROJUCING AN
ADDITIONAL ANNUAL REVENUE OF \$15,269 OR 7.25%.

BY ADVICE LETTER NO. 30, FILED ON JANUARY 25, 1995.

SUMMARY

This Resolution authorizes TCWC to increase rates by \$15,269 or 7.25% to recover costs in capital investment in water utility plant. This new facility was authorized in TCWC's last general rate case as per Resolution W-3821, dated January 7, 1994. The increase will not result in a rate of return greater than last authorized for TCWC.

BACKGROUND

TCWC requests authority under Section VI of General Order 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase rates in order to offset an investment of \$108,344 for a new well and telemetry system. TCWC presently serves approximately 904 flat rate customers and 16 commercial metered customers in Tahoe Cedars and adjacent areas located in El Dorado and Placer Counties near Tahoma.

The present rates became effective January 7, 1994, pursuant to Resolution W-3821, which authorized a general rate increase of \$40,746 or 24.0%.

DISCUSSION

In its last general rate case, filed by draft advice letter on April 27, 1993, TCMC clearly demonstrated the need for a new well and a new telemetry system. Authority to build the well and telemetry system and file an advice letter to recover the costs was granted under Ordering Paragraph #3 of W-3871, which states in part, "Tahoe Cedars Water Company is authorized to file an advice letter requesting additional rate increases after completion of the new well and telemetry projects in progress."

Service is satisfactory. There are no Commission orders requiring system improvement, nor are there service problems requiring corrective action.

The Water Utilities Branch (Branch) recommends that TCWC be authorized to increase its rates to recover the costs of the new well and telemetry system that has been added to rate base. The annual bill for customers of TCWC's flat rate customers will increase from \$206.65 to \$221.63, a rise of 7.25%. TCWC's original request for an 8.6% increase is incorrect. TCWC's income tax calculation was in error.

NOTICE AND PROTESTS

TCMC published a notice of this proposed increase in a local newspaper on February 14, 1995. There were no protest letters.

FINDINGS

The Commission finds, after investigation by the Branch, that the rate increase proposed by Tahoe Cedars Water Company is just and reasonable to recover the cost of adding a new well and telemetry system.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Takee Cedar Water Company is authorized to make effective revised Schedule 1A (Annual General Metered Service), and Schedule 2SR (Residential Flat Rate Service), attached to Advice Letter 30, and to concurrently cancel the presently effective rate schedule. The effective date of the revised rate schedule shall be five days after the effective date of this resolution.
- 2. This Resolution is effective today.
