## RESOLUTION

(RES. W-3987), AMBIER PARK WATER UITLITY (AFHU) , CRTER AUIHCRIZING AN INIERIM GENERAL RATE INCREASE PROCUCING ADDITICNAL ANMAL REVENEE CR $\$ 23,612$ (13.7t) IN 1996.

#### Abstract

SUMMARY This Resolution grants an interim increase in gross annual revenue of $\$ 23,612$ for Test Year 1996. The increase will prowide AFWU with a rate of inetum of $6.5 \frac{7}{6}$ wich is roughly one-half of the rate of retum guideline for Class D water utilities. The increase is necessary to provide Apmu monies to pay its current querating experses.


## BACKGRGIND

APWU requested authority under Section VI of General Onder No. 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities code to increase rates by $\$ 77,320$ or 44.12\%. APW presently seives about 370 metered custaners in an uninoomorated anea of Monteney Oounty along the Salinas-Monterey highway (State Route 68).

APW's last general rate increase was authorized by Resolution W-3236, dated May 20, 1985, which granted an increase of $\$ 39,940$ or 534 . APWU received a one-time surchange for veimbursement of Califormia Department of Health Servioes fees in 1994.

## DISOUSSICN

APM's management states that expenses outweigh revenues, and that, without an interim rate increase, it will lose approximately $\$ 8,000$ in test year 1996. Additionally, AFMJ is behind in paying its power bills and other cperating expenses.

APw's informal nequest was converted to a formal matter (A.96-03-016, dated March 7, 1996) due to the response to the notice of the increase which was mailed to each custamer on January 12, 1996.

In view of this critical need for more mevente, and because the time nequired to process this case has been extended due to its conversion to a formal case, the Small Water Utilities Branch (Branch) reommends an interim rate increase be granted to APWU, subject to mefund, pending the final results of the staff investigation and the evidentiary hearing.

## NOTICR, RUBLC MESTANG, AND PROIESTS

A notice of the proposed rate increase was mailed to each customer on Jamuay 12, 1996. The Branch received faur telephone calls, fair letters, and two petitions bearing appraximately 320 signatumes representing about 306 households. They complained about the increase and requested that a formal hearing be held in Salinas, and an Administrative Law Judge be assigned to receive evidence.

Branch staff oonducted an informal public meeting on Monday, February 5, 1996, in Salinas to disciss the proposed increase. Approximately 70 customers attended. Most of the questions and comments were general in nature. Many were critical of the high service charge rate for langer meter sizes recpulied by Monterey Oounty for fire sprinklers. There were several questions regarding the oamission's procedures and the possibility of having a formal hearing in Salinas.

At the Branch's meoomended rates shown in Appendix $A$, the monthly bill for a typical hesidential APWJ custoner with a $5 / 8$-inch $\times 3 / 4$-inch meter would increase from $\$ 37.08$ to $\$ 38.69$; for a customer with a one-inch meter, the monthly bill would increase from $\$ 39.38$ to $\$ 45.99$.

FINDINGS

1. The intexim rates recaimended by the Branch (Appendix A) are reasonable and should be adopted.
2. The rate increase authorized herein should be subject to refund pending the completion of the staff investigation and the evidentiary hearing.

IT IS CRDERED that:

1. Anblér Park water utility is authorized to file an advice letter adopting the revised Schedule Nos. 1, General Metered Service, and 4, private Fire Protection, attached to this resolution as Appendix $A$, and concumently to cancel its presently effective rate Schedile Nos, 1 and 4. Its filing shall comply with General Order 96 -A. The effective date of the revised schedules shall be not carlier than five days after the date of its filing.
2. The rate increase authorized herein is subject to refund pending final resolution of Anbler Park Water Utility's rate increase request.

## 3. This resolution is effective today.

## APPIICABILITIY

Applicable to all water service fumished to privately-owned fine protection systems.

## TEPRITIORY

Arbler Park Sukdivision, Rim Rock Subdivision, and Ranchö El Tono Oountry Club, located 9 miles southwest of Salinas, Monterey County.

## RATB

## SPECIAL, OCNDTIINS

1. The fire protection service connection shall be installed by the utility and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
2. The minimum diameter for fire protection service shall be four inches, and the maximm diameter shall be not mone than the dianeter of the main to which the servioe is oonnected.
3. If a distribution main of adequate size to serve a private fire protection system in addition to all other nomal service does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a service main from the nearest existing main of adecpuate capacity shall be installed by the utility and cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
4. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systers to which no connections for other than fire protection puiposes are allowed and which ave regularly inspected by the underwiters having jurisdiction, ave installed acoonding to specifications of the utility and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector-type meter approved by the Boand of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage, or waste of water and the oost paid by applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to mefund.
