### **CEC: AB 1632 Report Recommendations**

- PG&E is undertaking actions responsive to the AB 1632 Report recommendations.
- Some information will be submitted along with the license renewal application.
- The use of 3-D Seismic Studies is being addressed in a separate application to the CPUC to be filed on January 15, 2010.



#### **Energy Division Questions**

#### ISFSI Impact from License Renewal

- DCPP can operate an additional 20 years beyond the current operating license without building additional dry cask storage.
- If PG&E builds additional dry cask storage, it will be in the context of nuclear decommissioning.



### **Energy Division Questions (cont'd)**

### **Decommissioning Trust Fund Impact**

- PG&E has no plans to use funds from the decommissioning trust since no additional ISFSI costs are contemplated for license renewal.
- PG&E is maintaining its non-qualified trust fund as the State has not conformed to the tax provisions of the Federal Energy Policy Act of 2005, which would have allowed us to fully contribute Humboldt decommissioning funds to the qualified trust.



### **Energy Division Questions (cont'd)**

#### **Environmental Issues**

- The NRC will prepare a supplemental EIS to support its license renewal decision.
- The environmental report filed with PG&E's NRC application will be filed with the CPUC license renewal application for CPUC information.
- The Coastal Commission has asserted that a coastal development permit (CDP) is required for license renewal. PG&E expects a CEQA analysis will be undertaken as part of the CDP process.
- CEQA is not triggered by the license renewal application to the CPUC.
