The muddy answer is "sort of." I included settlement folks because what we decide in our settlement has a direct impact on renewable QFs. I'm trying to get my arms around how many renewable QFs may be out there that might be caught off guard by this whole process. Since we are setting a new SRAC and taking away the must-take obligation for those under 20 MW, I want to be sure we know who those players are. I imagine the vast majority of renewable QFs are under 20 MW, but there are some greater than 20 MW. I also imagine a lot of renewable QFs may have already executed RPS contracts or may be in that process, but I want to know about those that haven't.

We're also trying to get our arms around the magnitude of QFs that may still need to be taken care of under some type of "QF Program" after the Settlement. We have to figure out staffing issues on that front.

I'm really sorry to do this, but I'm going to hit you with a data request. I'm sure most of you are not the right people to do this, but if you could forward the request along, that'd be great (I'm making sure it goes to Settlement folks so you know what I'm asking).

We're trying to find out some information beyond the semi annual reports on renewable QFs. We would like to know all of the info in the report (including nameplate/contract capacity, facility name, QF ID, fuel type, PURPA description (small power producer, etc.) but also we want to know if each QF is operating under an RPS or a QF contract and the contract termination date. If the facility is currently operating under a QF contract but is in the process of switching to an RPS contract, we'd like to know that as well. Possible categories for this group could include "negotiating an RPS contract" or "awaiting CPUC approval of RPS contract" or any other possibilities I haven't thought of. This info is only needed for renewable QFs (we have all the cogen info).

Trina, this should look remarkably like a response to a data request that was sent to me by Nate Bellino on 5/13/09 with a few other categories. I'm just curious if there are any updates from that time.
