Commissioner Simon and Paul -- It was great to see you both in this new year! I wanted to forward you our newly minted **2009 PowerPathway Report Card**.

You'll notice on the first page that we are doing 2 programs in the East Bay under the expanded PowerPathway umbrella.

The first is at **Laney College** as part of the PowerPathway Training Network focused on energy efficiency green jobs training. We supported them in their successful application for \$997K in stimulus funds to do energy efficiency training. As we discussed, we work pretty hard with the Dean level at Laney. I do need to go visit the higher ups in the Peralta District to make sure the District is aware of the collaborations taking place in their college.

The second is **at CSU-East Bay**, where we are partnering to build their capacity for training higher-end energy workers. They launched with our assistance a 4-course Certificate in Power Engineering. We would like to do more, and brought them into a statewide application for SmartGrid workforce training stimulus dollars. This was an application that paired PG&E with CSU-East Bay, StateState with SMUD, and SCE/SD&G to go after stimulus funding. We will not know the results until March. Please keep your fingers crossed.

Paul suggested we come in and get caught up on the latest PowerPathway strategy. It's been too long. I personally have appreciated your office's championship of the program. You've helped give PowerPathway wings. I think you'd be proud of how far we've come in 2 years once we get you caught up.
