Hi Theresa,

It isn't really a day trip, unless you plan for a really long day; it's in Avila Beach, which is just south of San Luis Obispo. If you drive, plan on a 3.5 hour trip one way from San Francisco (with no traffic). Commercial flights are also available into San Luis Obispo. They usually like to start the tour at 8:00 or 9:00 in the morning, just to make sure there is time for questions -- and the checking in process for security can be time consuming. If you are interested in seeing the spent fuel pools then you will definitely need to start early because the security & safety process to check into that section of the facility is another, separate process. What I have done in the past, including when I visited the facility as CPUC staff, is drive down the night before and stay in SLO or even better Avila Beach (and it makes it a kind of fun outing). We can pick you up at your hotel in the morning, and take you through security to the facility. Again, depending on whether you want to enter the spent fuel pool area, the tour is usually over by around 2 or 3 or so. That leaves time to drive back to SF that day, or to catch a commercial flight home that evening. We can work the tour timing around your schedule if you go the commercial flight route and need to leave by a certain time. But I highly recommend getting down there the night before, if you all can swing it.

Just a heads-up, too -- all Diablo Canyon visitors have to give certain information, include your social security number, to us for security purposes. I believe it's a federal requirement. We can get all that from you once we figure out a date, but I just didn't want that to be a surprise.

I'll check the 2nd and 3rd weeks of March, and mid-April, and get back to you.
