Permitting

- **Solano County:** PG&E obtained the following permits from Solano County. PG&E consulted with the County, which agreed that these permits are ministerial. The California Environmental Equality Act (CEQA) does not apply to ministerial acts (Public Resources Code section 21080(a), (b)(1)).

- o Grading Permit
- o Building Permit
- o Encroachment Permit

- **California Department of Fish & Game:** PG&E conducted pre-construction species surveys and consulted with CDFG. No discretionary approvals were required under the California Endangered Species Act.

- **General Order 131-D:** The project is a new generation facility of less than 50 MW total net capacity and is therefore exempt from the CPCN requirement. PG&E complied with the local consultation requirement under GO

131-D.
