Amy:

In our spreadsheet we indicated information that is readily available. I think all of this information could be turned around by March 17th (question number two). We also state that the information for question number three is readily available. However, as explained in our response, some of this information raises significant confidentiality concerns. We would feel more comfortable with providing estimates after we have a call with the other IOUs/Black & Veatch/CPUC. We are still unclear about what B&V intends to do with this information; a conference call to get a better understanding of the purpose of this request is fair.

Furthermore, in terms of the items that will take longer than a few weeks to turn around, we want to know what the information will be used for before we can submit an actual time estimate. I have heard that some of this information could take up to 5 months or longer to provide. We are concerned with the amount of time and effort this request will take. As mentioned in our response, the data is not static (changes monthly), B&V's intentions are ambiguous, and the request raises numerous confidentiality/security issues.

Again, knowing the purpose of this request and what the information will be used for is fair. A call will allow us to voice our concerns and come up with the best approach for all parties involved.
