PG&E celebrates Green Heroes of Oakland

PG&E recently turned the spotlight on Oakland's "Green Heroes," celebrating the local businesses and organizations that participated in PG&E's Greening of Oakland campaign, a series of green projects to help the city use less energy and reduce emissions. The event was held at the Paramount Theatre, one of three historic theaters the campaign helped by replacing its lights with energy-efficient bulbs.

Over the past two years, PG&E has committed \$3 million to the campaign, demonstrating our dedication to our communities, customers and the environment. In addition to the funding, PG&E, the City of Oakland and the Green Heroes participated in efforts such as distributing more than 7,000 compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) to the community during "National Night Out" events.

The campaign also replaced Lake Merritt's "Necklace of Lights," switching out 4,000 bulbs with CFLs, reducing emissions by 35,000 tons a

year. In addition, 2,900 businesses became more energy efficient through improvements like replacing steam traps for dry cleaners, also reducing carbon dioxide emissions.

“The Greening of Oakland campaign was a great opportunity for PG&E to help the City of Oakland become energy efficient and combat global warming,” said Tom Guarino, Government Relations manager. “We are proud to have partnered with the City of Oakland and 36 other businesses and organizations that are all committed to seeing a greener Oakland. Helping our local communities become greener is just one part of PG&E’s core goal of environmental leadership.”

Another long-lasting benefit for the community was also launched as part of the campaign: A job-training program with the Regional Technical Training Center to recruit, train and place Oakland residents in green jobs. Construction on 23 solar-powered Habitat for Humanity homes was also started, with plans for more homes in the works.

meet specified criteria as judged by an international panel of industry experts including national regulators, former heads of major energy companies and leading academics.

As part of becoming the leading utility in the United States, PG&E is committed to also leading the way in conserving energy and developing environmentally friendly practices. During 2008 alone, our customers reduced demand by 459 megawatts and saved 2,844 gigawatt-hours and 39.3 million therms. These energy efficiency savings equated to more than 1.8 million emitted tons of CO₂—having the same effect as removing almost 250,000 cars from the road for one year. The company also distributed more than \$198 million in rebates to our customers for the year.

Each year Platts receives over 200 nominations from more than 30 countries for the Global Energy Awards. Platts describes the recipient of this award as a company who has had a long-term commitment to energy efficiency and one who has embraced efficiency “in a way that seeks to make it work now and for the foreseeable future.”

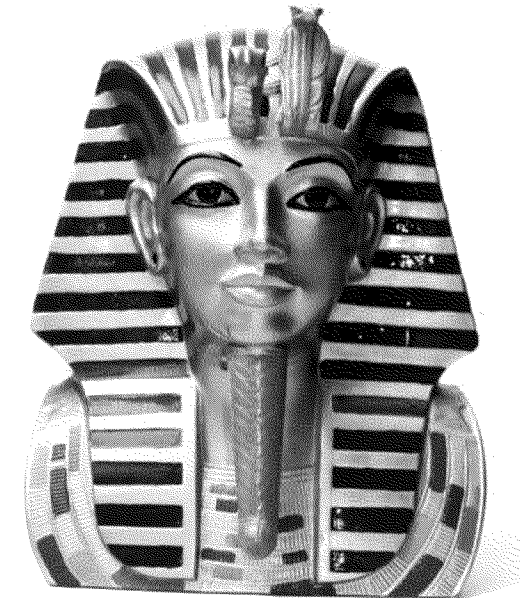

Job training for those in need

PG&E aids program in hard-hit area

Thanks to a donation from PG&E and Gill Ranch Storage, more than 60 students from the Westside Institute of Technology (WIT) in the economically hard-hit region of Mendota will be able to receive valuable job training. At a recent ceremony, PG&E and Gill Ranch Storage presented a check in the amount of \$32,600 to the WIT.

In keeping with PG&E’s commitment to supporting its communities, the donation will go toward retraining the students in the construction field. “This joint donation with Gill Ranch Storage LLC is a great opportunity for PG&E to sponsor employment-related training in the very economically challenged communities near the new Gill Ranch Storage Project,” said [Redacted](#) Gas Storage Development manager. “The Westside Institute of Technology is excited to add the Gill Ranch Storage and PG&E team to our partner list,” said David Castil lo, WIT director.

Located in western Fresno, the Gill Ranch Storage Project is an underground natural gas storage facility which includes a pipeline that will link the facility to PG&E’s mainline transmission system, resulting in service for customers throughout Northern and Central California. PG&E is the co-developer and part owner of the Gill Ranch Storage project.

The local communities around the project have been deeply affected by the recession, resulting in an unemployment rate of approximately 40 percent. The WIT works to make connections between local citizens and employers via training and education. PG&E’s donation plays an important part of the company’s dedication to our customers and communities in order to become the leading utility in the United States.
