Ayat, thank you for forwarding the information to us. We have reviewed this internally and offer the following comments/questions assuming that the other statewide program PPMs are expected to be at the same level as the PPMs laid out for RNC in this example:

- * The RNC template contained about 76 program metrics. This is an inordinate amount of metrics for just one subprogram in one SW program. If this is the expected metrics, then the total number when extracted for the entire portfolio becomes unreasonable, impractical, and potentially cost prohibitive. What is the process for determining the final and appropriate list of metrics by program, are the guidelines in the decision the means by which this will be done?
- * One of the criteria in the decision attachment states that trade-offs between quality of metrics versus cost should be considered. Should up front cost estimations be done to provide this information for decision making.
- * It may also be useful to determine who would benefit from knowing the metric on a regular basis. For example, would the following information be meaningful to managers, policy makers and other relevant stakeholders when collected on a regular basis or is it sufficient to document this in a process evaluation or EM&V report on the program?
 - * Number of Marketing Materials that have information on CAHP as well as NSHP.
 - * Number of new training courses at Energy Centers resulting from RNC efforts.
 - * Number of meeting with local governments to expedite permitting processes for CAHP.
- * Some of the metrics in the template can be easily collected and reported as part of process evaluations or the LI evaluations as in the example above. It is important that these considerations be made when determining what should be tracked by the IOUs or accomplished through EM&V. This would also determine the regularity of reporting the metrics.
- * For market transformation metrics, we urge that metrics be selected on the basis of the commitment to continue tracking these metrics for the long-term and not just this cycle.
- * At the upcoming meetings, it appears that much time will be dedicated to sharing "lessons learned" from the 2006-2008 EM&V studies, is there an expectation that IOUs and ED will work together to develop the final metrics at these meetings or some time later?

We look forward to meeting with you all in the upcoming weeks.
