Further, on April 19, PG&E filed its proposed Advice Letter 3653-E to implement the directives of the Resolution. It also modifies Subsection B.22 of PG&E's Rule 23 to provide that, "Customers receiving section 366.2(c)(13)(AC) notices regarding a CCA with more than one planned CCA phase in date will be provided the required 60-day notices based around the date their particular phase-in commences."
