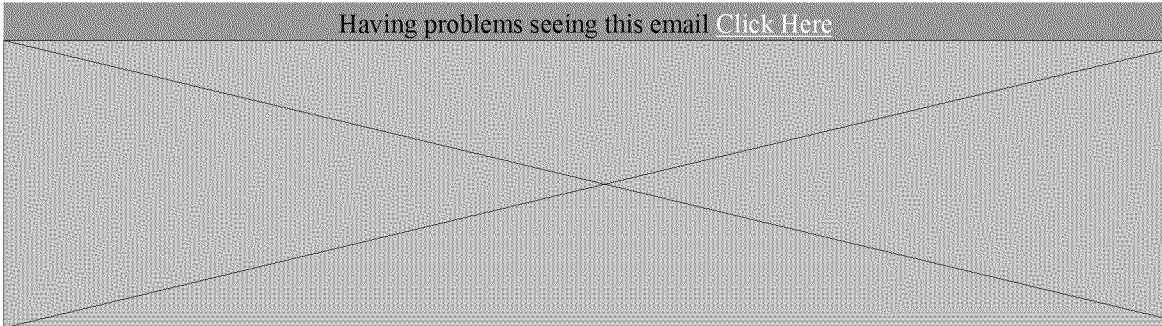
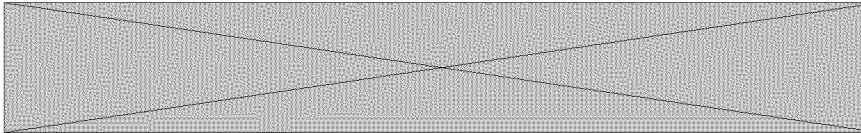

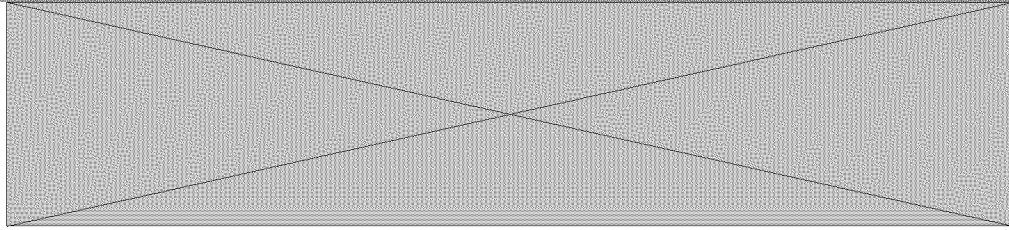
**Governor, Attorney General, and CPUC Announce \$400 Million Energy Crisis Settlement With Sempra Energy**
