Joyce,

This e-mail is to summarize our phone conversation last Friday, July 9 and in response to your e-mail of July 7 below.

The rate credit refund to PG&E's Core Aggregation customers Advice Letter (A/L) 3129-G started on July 1, 2010. Based on your e-mail below and the suspension notice from Energy Division of PG&E A/L 3129-G, dated July 7, 2010, PG&E's Information Systems Technology Services group is currently designing the solution to suspend the rate credit refund to PG&E Core Aggregation customers (A/L 3129-G). Because of the complicated nature of implementing a reversal of the rate credit, the earliest estimated date that PG&E can suspend the core aggregation credit rate refund is **July 24**.

Subject: PG&E Advice Letter 3129-G

PG&E filed AL 3129-G on June 24, 2010, requesting an effective date of July 1, 2010. SPURR protested AL 3129-G on June 25, 2010 requesting that the refund be amortized over 12 months rather than 6 months and that action on the AL be expedited. PG&E replied to the protest procedurally requesting that the full protest period be allowed.

We are suspending PG&E AL 3129-G effective today, and request that PG&E suspend all refunds subject to this the Advice Letter until this issue is resolved. The full protest period will be allowed to July 14, 2010.

Please inform us as to whether refunds under AL 3129-G have been started, and confirm that they are suspended effective today until resolution of this issue. thanks.
