# 9/24 San Bruno EOC Report:

- Debris removal continues. They are finished with three parcels and will continue to clear on Saturday. They have set up air testing sites at three locations in the canyon. They will also be helping the city with toxicity testing of the soil of the hillside.
- Jackie Speier will be holding a press conference at the site on Monday at 10:00 a.m. No one available at the city knew the topic of the press conference.
- The hotline was closed today and will be forwarded to individual staff offices in the city.

New legislation introduced at the Tuesday 9/21 San Francisco Board of Supervisors meeting:

- [Urging Pacific Gas and Electric to Cooperate with the City s Request for Infrastructure Information]
- Resolution urging Pacific Gas and Electric Company to cooperate completely and swiftly with all requests from the City Administrator and Fire Chief in a Utility Infrastructure Safety Review, and to provide all relevant City Departments with risk level and maintenance plan information for existing pipelines in San Francisco
- This resolution was voted on in a group with others. All present supervisors voted aye. There was no discussion of this resolution.

## State Government Relations

- Briefed Assembly leadership and utility committee staff on the gas transmission pipeline system and the top 100 list. Answered all the questions that were asked

and also provided a list of where the 47 locations were with respect to Assembly and Senate Districts so they know which district representatives have a location on the map. Contact: Kent Kauss

- Senate Energy, Utilities and Communications Committee along with the Senate Public Safety Committee will be scheduling a joint hearing in the State Capitol on Tuesday, October 19. Due to the fact that the NTSB has not issued any preliminary findings to this point the focus of the hearing will be on maintenance and inspection programs for natural gas pipeline infrastructure. # **Community Relations**

Assembling a team for the implementation details of the San Bruno Recovery Fund efforts to produce FAQ's, messaging, press releases, etc. Completed materials for communications with impacted homeowners as noted above.

As of 9/20, more than **350** checks have been disbursed to affected customers.

Community Relations established a process to deploy ten volunteers each day at the San Bruno recovery center from Monday, September 20 through Thursday, September 30. Volunteers will provide assistance to customers and act as the liaison to the PG&E claims team.

Managing PG&E's support of upcoming San Bruno focused organizations and events:

- 9/24 Friends Helping Friends fundraiser, at St. Robert's Church. PG&E donated SF Giants tickets for the raffle and is giving \$2,500 to help cover expenses)
- 9/25 Safety Fair at Lowe's in SSF. PG&E volunteers will educate Lowe's customers on safety and emergency preparedness. SSFFD and Vector Control will also participate.
- 9/25 Family fundraising event at San Bruno Park. Several local non-profits participating. PG&E donating funds to cover the cost of food and other expenses.

• Peninsula Humane Society: Contributed \$5,000 to help cover vet care costs for animals that were rescued.

- Silicon Valley Community Foundation: Contributed \$10,000 to go to San Bruno recovery efforts
- San Mateo County Critical Incident Stress Management Team: \$10,000 to go to counseling sessions for the next few months for emergency responders: Fire, Police, Communications dispatchers, Medics and Sherriff s Office

As of 9/23 PG&E employees have personally donated over **\$64,000** (combination of **\$20,350** direct online donations and **\$44,000** estimated vacation sale gross donations). Employee donations have slowed down and the giving site will be closed on 9/24. Employees will be redirected to donate via the Campaign for the Community.
