Corporate Affairs Run of Show Update- current/new info in red

- 9/20 7:00am Met with City of San Bruno Public Works Director to share detailed maps of PG&E's gas transmission system in the City. PG&E Staff: Kirk Johnson, Ben Almario and GovRel (Papia Gambelin and [Redacted]). Kirk answered several basic questions around age of infrastructure, federal and state guidelines, differences between transmission and distribution pipes and related standards. Klara wanted a copy of the map and Kirk indicated we will provide maps that do not include valve information due to security issues.
- 9/20 1:00pm Press Conference on the Top 100 List at G.O.
- 9/20 1:00pm Red Cross and other agencies, including PG&E, plan to meet at Peace Lutheran Church. PG&E Staff: [Redacted], Community Relations
- 9/20 4:00pm Meeting confirmed with Representative Speier to view a more detailed version of the gas transmission maps that show the shut off valves, the Top 100, and answer any other questions she may have. The meeting take place in her district office in San Mateo. PG&E Staff: [Redacted], Kent Kauss and Steve Whelan.
- 9/20 7:00pm Rep. Garamendi has requested a briefing on Top 100 in his District office. Awaiting confirmation on GT&D availability. Lead contacts: [Redacted] and Kent Kauss.
- 9/21 AGA is meeting with Senator Boxer's staff and Congressman Garamendi's staff to discuss pipeline safety issues. Lead contact with AGA: [Redacted] and

Jessica Hogle of Fed Gov Rel.

- 9/21 2:00pm EDT Rep. Matsui's Washington D.C. office has requested a briefing on San Bruno and the Top 100. Melissa Lavinson and [Redacted] will meet with [Redacted]r from her staff.
- 9/20 Funerals continue. San Bruno Mayor and City Manager plan to attend.
- 9/14 - 9/21 San Francisco Board of Supervisor introduced a resolution (9/14) urging PG&E to cooperate with the City Administrator and Fire Chief in a "Utility Safety Review" to provide the City and County of San Francisco with risk level and maintenance plan information for existing pipelines in San Francisco. The resolution includes a request for the report to be presented at a hearing within 45 days of the adoption of the resolution. The Fire Chief and City Administrator would present this report. The Board of Supervisors will vote on the proposed resolution on 9/21. On 9/14, PG&E, represented by Kirk Johnson, Brandon Hernandez and [Redacted] provided updates about the San Bruno incident to SF Fire Chief. PG&E discussed background information on the gas infrastructure, remote shut-off technology, leak survey results for CCSF and the transmission lines coming into San Francisco. Attendees included the Fire Chief's Deputy Chief of Operations, a representative from the City Administrator's Office and DPW Director (CCSF). GovRel Leads: Brandon Hernandez and [Redacted]
- 9/23 CPUC agenda item on their order of PG&E to investigate the explosion and to fund the investigation. Details of the draft resolution have not yet been released. Regulatory Relations will provide a copy when it is available. RegRel Lead: Bill Stock.
- 9/23 The House Energy and Commerce Committee, Subcommittee on Energy and Environment is planning to hold a hearing on pipeline safety with an emphasis on the Enbridge spill. The focus is not expected to be on San Bruno. AGA has been asked to testify.
- 9/28 Next regular San Bruno City Council meeting. GovRel Lead: [Redacted]
- 10/6 US House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure's Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials will conduct a hearing regarding the Department of Transportation's Inspection and Enforcement of Gas and Hazardous Liquid Pipelines has announced a hearing for this date. This may turn into a field hearing in California. Federal Government Relations Leads: Steve Kline and Melissa Lavinson.

Other Activities:

Media Relations has taken approximately 856 calls from media and done numerous on-scene interviews since the event began. Tone has been neutral to negative. Inquiries have ranged from seeking general information to in-depth details on our gas system. Media Relations will continue to pro-actively reach out to reporters who asked questions regarding the gas matters issue and the general San Bruno pipeline issue with approved messaging.

- Drafted Top 100 Call Guide and talking points for GenRef, Contact Centers, ES&S and Office Services.
- Developed Gas Safety Brochure for customers.
- Finalizing on-hold messaging and IVR script for Top 100 phone line.
- Reviewing a letter to the approximately 3,800 customers who live in close proximity to a Top 100 pipeline.
- Drafting a letter to those customers that requested information about gas pipelines near where they live and work.

Government Relations

Continues to respond to inquiries from local, state and federal officials as well as community leaders and stakeholders regarding the incident. Coordination with officials for press conferences, tours of the site, shelters and emergency centers. Outreach to the 43 jurisdictions that appear on the Top 100 list began Saturday 9/18. Outreach will continue through the weekend, and on Monday, 9/20.

Local Government Relations

Continued outreach to local elected officials and public officials regarding inquiries on pipeline safety.

San Bruno EOC Report:

- Today and continuing through the week, building officials from the City plan to visit the 32 green tagged homes and yellow tagged homes to begin the rebuilding process, including permit assessment and building inspections.
- On Wednesday 9/22 the City plans to commence debris removal (includes vehicle removal). All activities are being coordinated with County Environmental Health and Police Department.
- Police are looking to transition the Command Post during the debris removal to contracted security services through the County Sheriff's office. The City learned today they will need to go through a bidding process and wait up to 10 days before determining resource. City is inquiring with their legal on impacts to the city should they work with PG&E for a period of time to assist with costs. The city's initial concern are impacts with their ability to receive reimbursement from FEMA.

State Government Relations

Continued outreach to elected officials regarding inquiries on pipeline safety.

Federal Affairs:

House Members returned to their Districts this past weekend and are likely to remain in their districts through Tuesday evening.

Community Relations

As of 9/20, **more than 350** checks have been disbursed to affected customers.

Since 9/18 continued to deploy bilingual to 900 Cherry Street, San Bruno to assist our efforts as translators. A volunteer schedule was developed with significant support by the ERGs. Requested dialects are as follows but not limited to: Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Italian and French.

Community Relations established a process to deploy ten volunteers each day at the San Bruno recovery center from Monday, September 20 through Thursday, September 30. Volunteers will provide assistance to customers and act as the liaison to the PG&E

claims team.

As of 9/20 PG&E employees have personally donated more than **\$55,000** (combination of **\$19,600**– direct online donations and **\$35,920**– estimated vacation sale gross donations).

Today (9/20) at 1:00pm Ezra Garrett will be meeting with a non-governmental organization (NGO) task force to discuss strategies and coordination efforts to support the affected community.

Today (9/20) the Campaign for the Community will be launched. Aligning all messages and communications to address enhanced employee interest in the San Bruno incident and emergency preparedness. Established an initiative for PG&E to match up to \$100,000 in donations directed to the American Red Cross.

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Government Relations

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
