Rarely do we think of pipelines, and if we do we conjure up images of caribou keeping warm in winter near the Alaska pipeline. There is another pipeline story. This week the subject of pipeline safety was the focus of a hearing in the Senate Subcommittee on Surface Transportation.

In the busyness of the end of summer, few people paid attention to the pipeline accident on Sept. 9 in San Bruno, Calif. The blast killed seven people, injured many more and destroyed 37 homes. As Mayor Jim Ruane of San Bruno testified, a 44-year-old mother and her daughter died, leaving behind a father. Another daughter, a 20-year-old woman who was visiting her boyfriend during a break from work, died and her boyfriend remains in the hospital with critical burn injuries.

Dominion replacing gas lines for \$2.5B By Evan Bevins October 4, 2010 MARIETTA - Dominion East Ohio is in the midst of a 25-year, \$2.5 billion program to replace about 4,000 miles of the 21,000 miles of natural gas lines in its system, making them more resistant to corrosion.

Locally, the targeted lines are smaller distribution lines, not the larger transmission pipelines like the one that exploded Sept. 9 in San Bruno, Calif., causing the deaths of eight people and destroying dozens of homes.
