WOMEN'S ENERGY MATTERS MOTION TO REMOVE WEM FROM "JOINT REPORT"

Women's Energy Matters (WEM) makes this motion to remove WEM as a signatory to the "Joint Workshop Report" filed by PG&E on October 22, 2010.

WEM did not agree to the language on p. 2 of the report which appeared in the final version that we received from MEA Friday morning:

The term administrator is used throughout this Report to generally refer to any party that receives funding for and/or implements EE programs and is not meant to limit parties' interpretation of the term in subsequent comments.

We informed Sandy Lawrie of our objection. Sandy coordinated the changes on the report on Friday, October 25th. We also objected to the way PG&E worked to convince CCA parties that the report had to have a definition of administrator, rather than allowing parties to look it up in the dictionary. Marin's representative informed the undersigned that the dictionary definition of administrator was what they meant.

For example, the above definition makes not sense in this sentence in the CCA section:

The simplest and preferred approach for CCA administration of energy efficiency programs within their territories would be to coordinate with an independent (non-Investor-Owned Utility) thirdparty general administrator of energy efficiency in California. An independent administrator for California would neither receive funding for nor

implement EE programs.

WEM put in a great deal of time and effort working on the report, and we therefore wanted to be included in the Joint Parties. We hoped that by staying involved, we would be able to convince PG&E to take this language out because it did not truly represent agreement by the parties, including WEM. We were mistaken. Therefore we now request that our name be removed as a joint party signing on to the motion and the report.
