Re: Safety Response to the San Bruno Pipeline Explosion

Dear Mr. Cherry:

Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Commission's safety oversight over Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E's) natural gas pipelines, I direct PG&E to provide the following information:

- 1) A gas curtailment plan for San Francisco and portions of the Peninsula affected by the Commission-ordered reduction in pressure on the local transmission system downstream of the Milpitas Terminal to the extent that the Commission were to determine it would be unsafe to allow PG&E to increase the operating pressure at this time.
- (2) An electricity contingency plan in the event gas service is curtailed to the Potrero Power Plant.
- (3) The results of the "detailed analysis," which on the bottom of page 1 of PG&E President Johns' September 20, 2010 letter to me, he stated that PG&E was performing concerning the effects of the reduction of operating pressure and the possible strategies to reduce or avoid customer curtailments this winter. He committed to share the results of PG&E's analysis with me and my staff.
