To answer your questions below:

Question 1: Were there any non-residential customer classes that were impacted directly by the explosion?

Response: Yes, there is one non-residential customer in the affected area, a commercial customer address for the City of San Bruno.

Question 2: If so, why were they excluded from the bill relief?

Response: The non-residential customer will not be excluded from the bill relief. PG&E inadvertantly did not include the commercial customer in its requested tariff revisions and can revise and supersede the tariff sheet with a substitute sheet to reflect this non-residential customer.
