Changes in Rates for Agricultural Customers

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) would like you to know important information about your Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E rates.

- > Your electricity rates will change beginning February 1, 2011.
- You will be transitioned into TOU rates (i.e., different prices for different times during the day).
- If you are already on TOU rates, then the change shouldn't impact you unless you choose to get a lower TOU rate by choosing a new rate structure (see below).
- Contact PG&E if you don't already know about this change.

The transition to a TOU based pricing will begin for small and medium sized agriculture customers (<200 kW) on February 1, 2011. Under this new TOU pricing structure, you will pay **more** for electricity between the hours of noon to 6 p.m.; you will pay **less** during other times of the day.

Small and medium sized agriculture customers may also participate in Peak Day Pricing (PDP). This is a good option for customers who can reduce or shift energy usage during certain days. Customers who participate in this program will have a higher rate between 50-90 hours of the year in exchange for a lower TOU rate from May to October.
